We've had a few nice days of weather and I was able to get out detecting a couple of times and enjoy not being drenched for once. I spend a fair amount of time researching places to detect and find it more difficult to find new locations to explore. How are you doing at this? I have a few old maps and books about history of Portland and Vancouver. Use Google Maps, Google Earth and Historical Aerials as well as the GIS system here in Clark County. Using these tools I have located a few "out of the way parks" that once contained an old homestead or building. Last year I dug some really cool telephone insulators from one of these locations and on another spot found some military buttons. You have to be creative to find new spots. Good luck in your quest to find new locations.

Last month Diane and were absent from our regular meeting as we had traveled to Leavenworth, WA. For our anniversary (we met there). We had just left our house and were traveling north on I-5, heading to Tacoma to turn East. O.T.T.S. Monthly Club Hunt

April 30th 2023 Location: Clinton City Park, Franklin High School, Atkinson Elementary School



General Information: None

Historical Information: Acquired in 1948, Clinton Park is named after Clinton Street which abuts the park. Clinton Street is named for a popular pioneer minister, the Rev. Clinton Kelly. Kelly's brother, the Rev. Albert Kelly, has a park in southwest Portland as his namesake (Albert Kelly Park). Founded in 1914, Franklin is Portland's fourth high school.

Club Hunt Details

Hunt Results: 21 members and 4 guests turned out for the club hunt. Hidden on the day were 10 regular club tokens, three special tokens, two grab bag tokens, and 1 white zinc penny token good for a hat. There was a new challenge for members to participate in as well. Hunt Master Ryan gave one member the opportunity to "prove they know their machine" and they were given a red flag. Once and only once during the club hunt they would have an opportunity to mark a signal they believe is a dime. If they dig it up and it is a dime (witnessed by the Hunt Master or another member) they win a silver dime at count out. If they are wrong, they lose out because you only get one chance. Ryan randomly drew member names and Mike was given the flag for the day, and witnessed by Scott, planted the flag and then dug up a dime. Well done!

For natural finds in the park, the club did great. Ron found a 14k men's wedding band which wasn't very far from where he parked. Willy found a 1959 silver Washington quarter. Jeff, Harold, Lee, Steve and Laura found silver jewelry. Laura also found the oldest coin on the day, a 1936 wheat penny.

At count out, Ashley claimed a silver quarter for finding the new special token. The other two special tokens were not found and Ryan recovered them. Lee got to try the grab bag, getting five seconds to reach in and pull out a prize. He pulled out a plastic token in a cardboard flip, better luck next time! Club members only turned in 2 of the 10 club tokens good for a silver dime each. The remaining tokens are still in the park and good for a silver dime at any club meeting. Allisyn found the white zinc penny good for a hat and won a black Deus hat. The trash derby item was a pull tab, and Harold won a silver dime for his astonishing total of 32 collected on the day. The pull tabs will be donated to the American Legion.

For the membership drawings, Allisyn and Jerry both won Franklin half dollars. Ashley won a Washington quarter. There was an extra member draw due to Willy finding a silver coin, and as fate would have it, Willy's number was drawn and she won a Mercury dime.

The next club hunt will again feature two special tokens worth a silver quarter, and a special token good for a 1948 Swiss 2 Franc donated by Ed.



Heading South on I - 405 take exit 4. At 2nd light turn left onto Maple Valley Hwy. (Hwy. 169) Heading North on I - 405 Take exit 4. Stay to the right onto Maple Valley Hwy (169) Continue on Maple Valley Highway (169) for about 5.7 miles. Turn right at 152nd Ave SE and park in the parking lot on the right near the highway.

Heading from Hwy. 18 take exit onto 231st St SE. Go east 1 block. Turn left onto Maple Valley Hwy (169) heading towards Renton. Turn left onto 152nd Ave SE. Parking is on the right near the highway. Hunt site is about 9 miles from hwy 18 exit.

You will be able to use any prize tokens you find. This hunt will have prizes (including 1200+ silver coins, metal detector and a gold coin) as well as mix of coins and lion surprises.

Hunt rules: New Life Church is allowing us to use their property-please treat their field and property with respect: tokens and coins will not be buried—just hidden in the grass. Hunting in the fields prior to or after the hunt is not allowed. You may use only one detector & pin pointer. Only registered hunters are allowed on fields during hunts (exceptions must be cleared in advance by hunt Chairpersons). Thunder Storms will delay or stop a hunt. If one occurs, the hunt may resume after the storm passes.







- I will appreciate and protect our heritage of national resources, wildlife, and private property.
- I will use thoughtfulness, consideration and courtesy at all times.
- I will abide by all laws ordinances or regulations that may govern my search, or the area I will be in.
- I will fill all holes, regardless how remote the location, and never dig in a way that will damage, be damaging to, or kill any vegetation.
- I will report the discovery of items of significant historical value to a local historian or museum in accordance with the latest legislation.
