# **Club Hunt Details**

**General Information:** Covers 87.43 acres . Acquired in 1922

**Historical Information:** The parcel of land on which the park was developed was part of the James Loomis donation land claim. The city of Portland passed an ordinance in 1921 naming the park for Sylvester Charles Pier (1853–1935). Previously a sales manager of Marshall Wells Hardware Company, Pier took office as City commissioner in 1919, serving four years in charge of parks. His son, Stanhope S. Pier succeeded him as commissioner and served two terms. Prior to the park, St. Johns brick company operated just a block away, until 1905 when the factory ran out of clay. The abandoned brickyard was used as a playground until 1920 when the buildings were demolished. In development of the area which was previously a wetland more than 100 men were employed from the unemployment list. Wood from clearing the site was sent to local families in need of fuel.

Historical Event: On the morning of July 11, 1934, a train full of Portland police officers moved toward Terminal 4 in the St. Johns neighborhood. Their intent was to forcibly break the picket line of striking longshore workers, but near the intersection of what is now Columbia Boulevard, picketers blocked the train's passage. Following the police chief's orders, officers opened fire on the unarmed workers. Four were wounded, but the picket line held firm. The event became known within the International Longshore and Warehouse Union as "Bloody Wednesday." Ryan P. and Matt N. hid 10 regular tokens and one special token. The club was only able to recover two of the regular tokens and

the special token. Lee H. found the special token and won a 1957 quarter. The remaining club tokens are still in the park.

**Hunt Results:** The OTTS October Club Hunt was held on Sunday the 28th. We met at the Safeway located at 8330 N Ivanhoe St. 19 members met between 8:15 and 8:45 am. The club left for the park at 8:55AM. It was a gorgeous and unusually warm winter day at the park. Lots of Frisbee golfers at the park giving us funny looks and curious as to why there were so many of us at the park (it's rare to see one person MDing, let alone 19 of us!)

Ryan P. and Matt N. hid 10 regular tokens and one special token. The club was only able to recover 4 of the regular tokens and the special token was not recovered. The remaining club tokens are still in the park.

Based on past hunt data, this was one of the better days the group has had in a long time. For the past few hunts, Ryan I decided that we would hold another member drawing IF someone found a silver coin. We have not had the opportunity until the Pier Park hunt. To our amazement, a total of 6 silver dimes were found that day (details below). We held 6 separate draws and awarded 6 silver dimes to 6 different members.

To keep things fun and fresh, Ryan and I also decided to award silver dimes for new rotating categories. A silver dime was given to Rick G. for having the worst Zinc Lincoln. And Byron was awarded a silver dime for having the best of the best jewelry for his stunning silver and natural pearl ring.

The top 6 winners at the hunt were:

- 1) Matt N. 124 points
- 2) Tim S. 92 points
- 3) Rick G. 87 points
- 4) Scott Jo. 82.1 points
- 5) Laura A. 63 points
- 6) Harold V. 56 points

Matt N. won the membership drawing, winning a 1942 Walker half dollar.

The oldest coin was found by Rick G. - a heavily circulated and worn 1903 Barber dime. Tim S. pulled a beat up no date V nickel. Club members found a total of 18 wheat pennies. The oldest wheatie was a 1917 found by Bill B. Three pieces of silver jewlery were also found (Silver pearl ring by Rick G, Silver pearl ring by Byron B. and a silver bracelet by Scott Jo.

Total clad found: \$23.94

Trash collected during the hunt: 48.7 lbs.

# **Club Member's Experiences**

#### From Rick G.

Had a surprise two-day business trip to Silver City New Mexica Dec 1<sup>st</sup>. Of course I always bring an Equinox with me. The first afternoon I was able to find 2.5 hours to detect before dark in the main park in town. It was obvious that the towns folk are not used to seeing detectorists as to the number of people that wanted to talk. The results of the hunt were staggering. This is not an old park and the finds were contemporary but the clad targets were amazing. 2.5 hours produced \$11.20 in clad including 34 quarters, and a 1992 Kennedy half. Can you say Virgin Park?



The next day my work day was a bit shorter and I was able to spend some real time detecting the same park. This time I was also able to get on some jewelry finds, but the winner was the clad again. \$32.95 in clad plus pennies in 6 hours of detecting (325 coins). The killer with this was that I found 88 quarters! I did find one wheat cent, 1951, and a pair of rings, a locket, earrings.... 8.5 hour clad/pennies total of over \$46!!!



The best part about this 8.5 hours of detecting was one of the rings that I found. It was a non-conventional class ring inscribed "Rikki" and "SHS 20214".



After a couple days of web sleuthing and a few mis-steps I located the original owner in Tuscon AZ. Rikki had lost her class ring two weeks after she got it. It has been sitting in the dirt in that park for 7 years. I am shipping the ring back to her this week. I love this hobby.


## O.T.T.S. Club Meeting Location
