General Information: None

Historical Information: In 1891, the City of Albina bought a tract of wooded land to be used for Albina's first park, however, it wasn't developed until after Albina consolidated with the City of Portland. In 1909, G.H. Hoch, the head gardener for Washington Park, oversaw the design work for Columbia Park. He patterned the park after a famous park in Berlin, Germany. Columbia Cottage was built in 1940 and has served as a field house, dance hall, and National Guard command center.

For natural finds in the park, the club as a whole felt like the targets were few and far between. However, with 22 people hunting there was bound to be some nice finds and there was! Harold found an 18k diamond ring which he said might be the best he's ever found. Harold and Lee H. found silver jewelry. Jackee and Ashley found buffalo nickels, Ashley's had a date visible of 1936. Ashley also found the oldest coin on the day, an 1898 2 Filler, a Hungarian coin.

At count out, it was discovered that nobody found either of the special tokens. Laura got to try the grab bag, getting five seconds to reach in and pull out a prize. She pulled out a 1899 Morgan Silver Dollar COPY, better luck next time! Club members turned in 7 of the 10 club tokens good for a silver dime each. The remaining tokens are still in the park and good for a silver dime at any club meeting. Nobody found the white zinc penny good for a hat, and Ryan recovered all the missing special tokens.

For the membership drawings, Laura S. and Lee S. both won Franklin half dollars. Jeff and Dan both won Washington quarters.

The next club hunt will again feature two special tokens worth a silver quarter!





Driving directions:

Heading South on I - 405 take exit 4. At 2nd light turn left onto Maple Valley Hwy. (Hwy. 169) Heading North on I - 405 Take exit 4. Stay to the right onto Maple Valley Hwy (169) Continue on Maple Valley Highway (169) for about 5.7 miles. Turn right at 152nd Ave SE and park in the parking lot on the right near the highway.

Heading from Hwy. 18 take exit onto 231st St SE. Go east 1 block. Turn left onto Maple Valley Hwy (169) heading towards Renton. Turn left onto 152nd Ave SE. Parking is on the right near the highway. Hunt site is about 9 miles from hwy 18 exit.

Silver Dollar Raffle: There will be several drawings for a silver dollar throughout the day.

Main Raffle: Tickets will be available throughout the day. Prizes include: a "Lions Lair Treasure Feast," a Gold Coin, Metal Detector as well as other great prizes.

Opening Ceremony: Will begin at 8:45am.

Rise of the Silver Lion (The Hunt Begins) Searching to feed the lion st hunt: 9:00 - 9:45am family-tokens in the field, are good for prizes, including 650+ silver dimes.

2nd hunt: 11:00-11:45am Lions Prey (Return to the Lair) The Beast has been caught—Tokens are good for prizes (including 900+ silver coins, metal detector, and a gold coin) a mix of coins in the field. 12:00 - 1:15pm Our annual BBQ potluck: bring favorite side dish, salad, or dessert. CTC will supply plates, napkins, eating utensils, hamburgers, hot dogs, buns and condiments.

Lion's Lair. (Distribution of the kill) The family Feast.—During the last 15 3rd hunt: 1:45 - 2:45pm minutes of this hunt, the other two fields will be re-opened to hunt as well. You will be able to use any prize tokens you find. This hunt will have prizes (including 1200+ silver coins, metal detector and a gold coin) as well as mix of coins and lion surprises.

Hunt rules: New Life Church is allowing us to use their property-please treat their field and property with respect: tokens and coins will not be buried—just hidden in the grass. Hunting in the fields prior to or after the hunt is not allowed. You may use only one detector & pin pointer. Only registered hunters are allowed on fields during hunts (exceptions must be cleared in advance by hunt Chairpersons). Thunder Storms will delay or stop a hunt. If one occurs, the hunt may resume after the storm passes.


