



Concept of Pedagogy of Critical Love

One of the great problems of history is that the concepts of <u>love and power</u> have usually been contrasted as opposites —polar opposites —so that love is identified with a resignation of power, and power with a denial of love ...

"All the great movements for social justice in our society have strongly emphasized a love ethic." (bell hooks 2000, p. xvii)




2023-24 District Goals

Goal 1:

By June 2024, 100% of BKNHS will partner with industries to offer career pathways, authentic workbased learning experiences, enriched by industry and academic partnerships and career-connected learning informed by student voice and choice, where students are ignited by rigorous, dynamic hands-on experiences in 21st century, technology-infused classrooms, that inspire them in their pursuit of passions and goals.

Goal 2:

By June 2024, all BKNHS will provide a highquality student experience that is culturally responsive and sustaining, includes standards-aligned curricula with formative assessments for progress monitoring, and ensures that all students read and integrates highly impactful instructional and SEL practices, whereby 100% of our students will graduate with a 10% increase in college & career readiness.



Goal 3:

By June 2024, all BKNHS will create or expand their parent engagement plans to increase family involvement in our schools through collaboration and partnership with community stakeholders, empowering parents to be supporters, monitors, and advocates to sustain and advance student academic outcomes and personal success.

Goal 4:

By June 2024, the BKNHS district chronic absenteeism rate will decrease by 7%, and overall attendance will increase by 5%, with an interdisciplinary attendance team that includes school stakeholders (counselors, administrators, school partners); structures for data monitoring and analysis, evaluation and assessment; and opportunities for meaningful stakeholder engagement.


2023-24 District Instructional Priorities



Priority 3: Student needs are identified through a continuous cycle of collaborative analysis of assessment data in order to reflect, track progress and set goals.

Priority 4: Students engage with differentiated tasks/assessments that are aligned to learning targets and emboldened literacy skill development in order to independently demonstrate mastery with knowledge and skills.








Brooklyn North High Schools as of 8-23-23

- Culturally responsive-sustaining education (CRSE) is grounded in a cultural view of learning and human development in which multiple expressions of diversity (e.g., race, social class, gender, language, sexual orientation, nationality, religion, ability) are recognized and regarded as assets for teaching and learning

- Office and front desk personnel should be responsive, attentive, informed, pleasant and engaging.

- Schools should nurture an environment of social-emotional wellness, with rich expectations regarding resilience, success and risk-taking.

My Brother's and My Sister's Keeper @ Brooklyn North High Schools

Brooklyn North currently has approximately 11,000 Black and Latino male students across 47 schools and 9,000 Black and Latino female students.

While there was an average of 82% graduation rate for Black and Latino students in Brooklyn North High Schools in 2018, there was a 15% graduation rate gap when compared to non-Black and Brown students.

MBK and MSK @ Brooklyn North High Schools seek to provide opportunities for leadership development for these students, in order to close the achievement gap. Leadership training lifts these tenets for each program.

What's Happening at Brooklyn North HS?

On 8/29, Superintendent Ross and the district team welcomed hundreds of BKNHS families to share the "State of the District" and our vision, mission, goals, and priorities for the 2023-24 school year.

Parents / guardians enjoyed a plenary session and workshops on topics such as: graduation requirements & understanding transcripts, supporting your child's socialemotional needs, ELA and math curriculum, supporting ENL students and students with IEPs, resources and guidance to prepare for college and career.
