




### Brooklyn North High Schools Demographics

### Superintendent's Message




Dear Brooklyn North High School Community,



# **District Vision**

## **District CEP Goals & Strategies**



### Priority 1 – All students learn to read well

#### Goal:

By June 2024, district passing rate, as measured by the ELA Regents exam, will show a district average increase of 5 - 7% from 56% to 61 - 63%.

### Strategies:

(1) Partner with Dr. Donyall Dickey and Dr. Kristina Doubet, to implement differentiated tasks / assessments that are aligned to learning targets so students can independently demonstrate proficiency with literacy skills including vocabulary and reading comprehension.

(2) Support implementation of HMH Into Literature - developing lessons and using assessment data to drive pedagogy.

(3) Support MLL liaisons with researched based strategies and inquiry cycles.

### Priority 2 – All students are physically and emotionally safe

### Goal:

By June 2024, the number of level 4 and 5 district incidents will decrease 3% as measured by OORs; and there will be a 10% increase in students reporting in the NYC Survey that "there is time to process feelings and emotions in school."

### Strategies:

Targeted schools will have a comprehensive walkthrough grounded in the Supportive Environment Framework that includes assessment of school systems, observations of

classrooms, structured debrief with actionable next steps.

In collaboration with OSYD, District will provide OORS / SOHO training and norming to support effective data analysis, implement effective crisis team, mindfulness and Restorative Justice practices to support proactive SEL for all students.



## **District CEP Goals & Strategies**



Priority 3 – All students have a high-quality academic experience

*Goal 1:* By June 2024, the average passing percentage will increase by 4% to 61%; and the district average Algebra I Regents score will increase by 3.2 points to 64.3.

Strategies: 40 schools will pilot Illustrative Math to ensure students have access to standards-aligned curriculum that is relevant to their cultural backgrounds and lived experiences. District will provide professional development in advance of each unit plus *i*n-school coaching in partnership with New Visions with some schools also supported by STEM strategies. Support included: content coaching, building capacity during through teacher teams and for leaders to develop systems to monitor implementation. *Goal 2:* By June 2024, to strengthen the quality of implementation of district IEPs for all students with disabilities, alignment of IEP-recommended services across SESIS and STARS will increase by 3%, from 93% to 96%, as measured by IEP Review, program service report, SESIS IEP completion report.

Strategies: Support all schools until they attain 95% fully served SWDs with inschool system and structure development and monitoring. Through monthly convenings and in-school support, Administrators of Special Education will support School Implementation Teams to monitoring the quality and timeliness of IEPs. *Goal 3:* By June 2024, the percentage of district MLs/ELLs being provided their Part CR 154 mandated services will increase by 3%, from 86% to 89%, as reported in Power BI.

Strategies: Provide monthly professional developemtn plus in-school and virtual support for leaders and programmers to develop programs that prioritize MLs/ELLs mandated services in collaboration with our district APPAs, the Division of Multilingual Learners and the Brooklyn North policy implementation (compliance) team.

## **District CEP Goals & Strategies**



Priority 4: All students graduate college and career ready and have a strong plan and pathway to economic security

### Goal 1:

By June 2024, on average, Brooklyn North HS will increase attainment of Advanced Regents diplomas by 3%; and there will be a 6% increase in district students enrolled in an Advanced Placement, College and IB courses.

### Strategies:

All students in Brooklyn North high schools will have access to opportunities to earn early college credits through Advanced Placement, dual enrollment, and International Baccalaureate courses. Refining instruction and implementing standards-aligned curricula in ELA and Math will allow more students to achieve college-ready results in the Regents exams.

### Goal 2:

By June 2024, there will be a 10% increase in the number of New York State Seal of Biliteracy awardees in Brooklyn North High Schools.

### Strategies:

To increase the number of NYSSB graduates and, in turn, Brooklyn North High Schools' College, Career and Civics Readiness Index, we will: (1) hold information sessions for school leaders on the benefits that the NYSSB program will bring to their students and school community at large; (2) connect school leaders with resources (data, programming support, DML support) to strategically identify and support eligible students; (3) support the NYSSB coordinators; (4) and develop a roster of NYSSB advisors and panelists for low incidence languages so that all bilingual/biliterate students are afforded equitable opportunities to earn the NYSSB



## **District CEP Goals & Strategies**



**Priority** 5 – All districts and schools are more inclusive and responsive for parents and families, including having more families choose NYC Public Schools

#### Goal 1:

By June 2024, By June 2024, parent involvement will increase by 5% showing that at least 75% of families in BKNHS will respond favorably that they are involved in schools as reported in the NYC school survey.

#### Strategies:

Ensure parent coordinators effectively use the monthly Activity Report to document offerings. Provide monthly professional learning and weekly office hours for PCs to continue training and elevate effective practices. Model parent engagement by hosting at least 3 district-wide events. Support schools to develop effective SLTs and Parent Associations.

### Goal 2:

By June 2024, the district will collaborate with stakeholders, including students and families, to reimagine at least 1 campus.

### Strategies:

Apple Education

Collaborate with the Office of District Planning, elected officials and community stakeholders to assess portfolio needs to inform the design of a new high school and/or reimagining current schools in a high-needs community.

### Goal 3:

By June 2024, 10 schools will engage in a Future Classrooms initiative to reimaging the learning environment.

#### Strategies:

Inspire and model for leaders by holding principals conferences in innovative spaces. Partner with industry experts and DIIT to implement innovative curriculum and pedagogy (i.e. PrismsVR, LINC, Apple)







# 2023-24 District Goals

#### Goal 1:

By June 2024, 100% of **BKNHS** will partner with industries to offer career pathways, authentic workbased learning experiences, enriched by industry and academic partnerships and career-connected learning informed by student voice and choice, where students are ignited by rigorous, dynamic hands-on learning experiences in 21st century, technology-infused classrooms, that inspire them in their pursuit of passions and goals.

### Goal 2: By June 2024, all BKNHS will provide a highquality student experience that is culturally responsive and sustaining, includes standards-aligned curricula with formative assessments for progress monitoring, and ensures that all students read and integrates highly impactful instructional and SEL practices, whereby 100% of our students will graduate with a 10%

increase in college & career readiness.

### Goal 3:

By June 2024, all BKNHS will create or expand their parent engagement plans to increase family involvement in our schools through collaboration and partnership with community stakeholders, empowering parents to be supporters, monitors, and advocates to sustain and advance student academic outcomes and personal success.

#### Goal 4:

By June 2024, the BKNHS district chronic absenteeism rate will decrease by 7%, and overall attendance will increase by 5%, with an interdisciplinary attendance team that includes school stakeholders (counselors, administrators, school partners); structures for data monitoring and analysis, evaluation and assessment; and opportunities for meaningful stakeholder engagement.

YTD Attendance: 89% Chronically Absenteeism: 12%

Brooklyn North High Schools are aligned with the <u>Pedagogy of Critical Love</u> where each student is seen, heard and affirmed to achieve their loftiest goals.


