 Plans
- The DCEP layout looks just like the CEP: It has the Mission, and Vision Statements of the District, as well as reviewed district data, annual goals, family and community engagement strategies, and plans of action.
- This year, there are some projected changes: The new DCEP is going to be aligned with the education plans of the NYS Education Department.
- It ties the Chancellor's priorities with NYSED's Pillars

- The new DCEP specifically details effective instruction and systems of social emotional learning, as well as systems for parent and community engagement.
- This creates accountability measures for the District to explain more of what they are doing and why they are doing it.
- Annual DLT goals, action plans, and strategies are up to date.
- The DLT will work on the new template once approved, and information will be uploaded to the <u>iPlan Portal</u> for public viewing: currently posted DECPs, and CEPs are for the 2018-19 school year.
- A large part of the DCEP is the Family and Community Empowerment section. The new DCEP has more structure, and systems are in place to support this part. This is a NY State aligned document. CECs are not mentioned in the current DCEP template, yet are a big part of community empowerment in the NYC School District.
