Minutes of the Regular Board Meeting of the Village of Southern View Board

The President and the Board of Trustees held the regular scheduled meeting on CALL TO ORDER:

Tuesday, January 24, 2023, at the Southern View Municipal Building, 3410 South Fifth Street, Southern View, Illinois. The meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm

by President Patsche, followed by Roll call and the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES: President Patsche asked whether the Board had reviewed the December 27, 2022, Regular Meeting Minutes and if they found need for any changes, corrections, or amendments. President Patsche stated after hearing none, the December 27, 2022, minutes stand approved as presented.

> Motion to approve the December 27, 2022, Meeting Minutes as presented by: Trustee LaRussa and 2nd by Trustee Eskew Upon roll call vote, all voted AYE; including President Patsche Trustee Bourland voted present MOTION PASSES.

APPROVAL TO PAY BILLS: President Patsche asked whether the board had reviewed the January 24, 2023, Bills to be Paid, and whether there were any changes, corrections, or amendments. President Patsche asked for a motion to approve the bills as presented.

APPROVAL OF THE TREASURER REPORTS: President Patsche asked whether the Board had reviewed the December 2022 Treasurer Report and if they found need for any changes, corrections, or amendments. President Patsche said hearing none, the December 2022 Treasurer Report stand approved as submitted.

Motion to approve the December 2022 Treasurer Report as presented by: Trustee Bourland and 2nd by Trustee Eskew Upon roll call vote, all voted AYE; including President Patsche **MOTION PASSES.**

PUBLIC COMMENTS: Bob Fields, owner of Magnolia Lane addressed the Board. Bob stated that the contract he had signed was out of dates and that he was not going to sign for an extension. The property was to close on January 9, 2023 and the buyers called on 12/30/22 asking for an extension and when he received the extension agreement there were adding financing, contingencies and had a new purchaser listed. Bob stated that his business had moved out of the property on January 6, 2023 in anticipation of the January 9, 2023 closing. Attorney Craven stated that there is an agreement to repay the \$237,000.00 in TIF funds that was transferred to the new buyers, if the buyers are not buying it then it falls back to the Fields as their responsibility. Bob stated he was not going to sign another contract and they would just move back to the building. Attorney Craven stated that they can talk after the meeting.

SueEllen Frederick stated she has seen at the corner of 5th Street and Linton there is a residence that has a tarp around their carport. SueEllen thinks it looks bad and that a letter needs to be sent. Trustee Eskew stated he does not believe there is an ordinance preventing tarps but he would stop by there and see what the purpose is. SueEllen asked what the status was on the property located by Thorntons. Trustee Eskew stated he had been told that it was 60-90 days out for the utilities to be cut but that has been way longer than that. Trustee Eskew stated that he had sent an email asking for the status of that property. SueEllen also asked about the property at 5th Street and St Joseph there is a bunch of trash in the hedge and looks awful. Attorney Craven stated that he will send out a letter.

Anna Berkley, resident on Spring Street questioned what is going on with all the wood at the corner at 1st and Cruinkshank. Trustee Bourland explained what happened several months ago at the Board meetings and he suggested that a letter needs to go out to the resident that it is her responsibility to clean up the branch pile.

Betsy Richbark, resident on 2nd Street, addressed the Board regarding the property at 2nd and Apple Orchard have bi-fold doors on their porch, Betsy stated it looks awful and could blow away in storms. Betsy also stated that there are large trucks parked in the parking lot adjacent to the ole Family Video. Betsy stated that the City had ran them off on 13th Street and now people are parking in that location even though it is zoned Commercial, it is close to residential property. President Patsche stated he will reach out to the owner of the property and see if they have permission to park there.

OLD BUSINESS DISCUSSION: President Patsche stated that Ordinance 22-12-01 will be tabled.

President Patsche asked for discussion and approval of the IDOT Condemnation of Village Property. President Patsche suggested that the Village send the engineer and attorney over to meet with IDOT to better understand how much of the property they are wanting for the roughly \$32,000. After the meeting, Kevin Kuhn and Don Craven can come back to the Board and discuss with the Board in length what options the Village has.

Motion to table the IDOT Condemnation of Village Property until Don Craven and Kevin Kuhn meets with the state regarding the Village options by Trustee Bourland and 2^{nd} by Trustee Eskew

Upon roll call vote, all voted AYE; including President Patsche **MOTION PASSES.**

NEW BUSINESS DISCUSSION: President Patsche asked for discussion and approval of the 2022 Motor Fuel Tax Program Closeout.

Motion to approve the 2022 Motor Fuel Tax Program Closeout by Trustee Bourland and 2nd by Trustee Briggs Upon roll call vote, all voted AYE; including President Patsche **MOTION PASSES.**
