Pastor's Report, Review/Approval of Minutes:

Parish Life (Joy Martin):

Community Outreach, which now includes the Healthcare Readifest and Angel Tree – Sue Balter

- Back Pack Buddy Program: The collection box has been placed in the church for the month of February's collection for the program. There has been only one donation as of February 17, 2018.
- Homebound Parishioners: Weekly contact is being made to several of the parishioners that are homebound.
- Multi-Purpose Community Action Agency: Rita Hasty continues to volunteer on a weekly basis.
- Readifest & Angel Tree: Sue spoke to Mary Ann Cecil about continuing to head these two projects under this committee and she declined. They need to find volunteers to take charge.
- On February 14 - Sue respectfully submitted her resignation as chairman of the Outreach committee and will finish this fiscal year until June. She will be glad to continue doing the Backpack Buddy drive quarterly.

Welcomers / Parish Directory– Barbara "Bonnie" Pass

- Since the last Parish Life meeting, the Welcomers Committee has had no Informational Meetings or contacts requesting information on becoming members of All Saints.
- A welcome gift basket was presented to both Ables family households.
- The Welcomers Committee met on 2-4-18 to discuss/finalize changes for 2018. After a couple of discussions with Father Johnny, this is where they are:
- The monthly Informational Meetings will be discontinued. The Welcomers Committee will meet with anyone who contacts the parish and expresses an interest.
- The Registration Form from the Information Packet will be placed on the tables in the back of the Church. The Committee will meet with those that register.
- The Informational Booklet that was distributed to interested parties has been discontinued. The Committee will use the Parish Ministries brochures as the only handout.
- Welcome Gifts will continue to be presented to new members by the Committee.
- Father Johnny and his wife will have a Welcome Dinner with the new family and one of the Committee members to welcome them and discuss the Parish and stewardship.

Respect Life, which includes the Community Baby Shower – Kelly Keller and co-chaired by Susan Costanza

- The Respect Life Committee was proud to host their first annual "Advent Rosary Prayers" last December. Before each Mass, during the month of Advent, a member of their committee led the parish in reciting one decade of the Joyful Mysteries of the Most Holy Rosary. Their intentions were for Parish Discernment. They hope to continue this tradition in future years. There are plans to include Rosary prayers during the season of Lent which are pending.

- On December 14, 2017, Kelly Keller and Susan Costanzo met with two Human Trafficking Case Managers for Catholic Charities in Louisville. They discussed how Catholic Charities helps those who are victims of human trafficking in the Louisville metro area.
- The Respect Life Committee will meet in early March to discuss planning an event at All Saints for Respect Life Month in October of 2018. Their plans will include having a speaker from Catholic Charities to come to help educate parishioners about the issue of human trafficking. They will provide a Power Point presentation for the parish. Food and drinks will be provided by the Respect Life Committee, as well as educational brochures and other resource information.
- For raising funds, they will consider requesting Admissions at the door in the form of financial donations to Catholic Charities Human Trafficking Division or basic toiletries for the human trafficking survivors they serve in the Louisville Metro area.
- Respect Life Committee will be reaching out to our sister church, St. Michael in Fairfield, in hopes to include them in this event as well any future events they have.
- They will also be discussing ways to involve the youth group. Most likely they will ask to host a movie night, during one of their Wednesday night meetings, before they have their main event.
- Their committee will advertise by creating a flyer to circulate in the bulletins, as well as including the events in the appropriate parish calendars. If needed, they may ask to be included in announcements during Mass.

Bereavement Meal –chaired by Kenny Harryman & co-chaired by Yvonne Niemann

- On February 12, Joy Martin sent an email to Kenny & Yvonne containing as much information needed for the committee

Healing Blanket – Patti Willey

- Patti went to see Pat Douglas and was given all that she had. There are 4 blankets that are done, a lot of Rosaries, prayer cards, extra material, etc. Patti took everything to the parish office with the exception of the extra material. She had Father bless the Rosaries and the Prayer Blankets that were completed. There were 2 blankets at the parish office also so they have a total of 6 completed blankets.
- Diane Faue has offered her help. She has an embroidering sewing machine for which Patti is so thankful for. They are going to revisit the Prayer Blankets and possibly make some changes. Possibly add some other styles like tied fleece, different styles of prayer blankets & flannel baby blankets. This would let others that do not sew be a part of the prayer blankets including the possibility of student projects. Diane is available later in March so we will get started then.

Socialites – Leslie & Carl Zoeller

- On February 28, Leslie communicated that she is considering naming the 50 plus group - Socialites. They will start with a questionnaire about interest put in the bulletin for the next month. Depending on interest, they will begin planning their first outing possibly at the Derby Dinner.

Long Range Planning (Tony Niemann):

- The LRPC met on 2-12-18 & we have 8 members. Gina and Chris Nelson will need to alternate in order to help to ensure that one of them can attend. Six members were present and two were absent. We changed our meeting day of the week to Wednesdays or Thursdays.
- We focused on pros and cons of three choices: renovating our current church; building a new church on the present site, or purchasing land for future development. We will continue discussions at our next meeting. We will look at three scenarios and choose one single plan to guide us through the next five years.
- We requested Father Johnny to set up a meeting between representatives of the archdiocese and the LRPC as soon as possible to assist us in planning and verifying our selection of one of the three choices.
- The LRPC meets again in 6 days on 3-14-18.

- New “official” Facebook page has been created and published
- Working to complete the review and update of our allsaintstville.org website
 - Updates will soon occur, No “new” content is being planned at this time
 - Requiring parish credit card to remove Joy’s and thereby take full administrative control of GoDaddy account
- Fr. Johnny has requested that we look at an updated phone system
 - Reviewing IP phone services (hosted in cloud) vs non-premises system. Available internet bandwidth may limit options

 - Need to meet with Mary Creed (possibly 3/10) to review software
