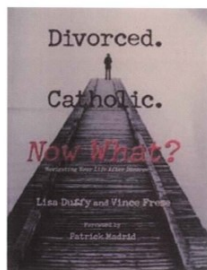
Divorced. Catholic. Now What?

Catechism Corner: *Holy Days of Obligation*



Holy Days of Obligation are principal feast days on which, in addition to Sundays, Catholics are obliged by Church law to participate in the Eucharist. It is also one of the precepts of the Church. (CCC Glossary, pg.

882) The precept of the Church specifies the law of the Lord more precisely: "On Sundays and other holy days of obligation, the faithful are bound to participate in the Mass." "The precept of participating in the Mass is satisfied by assistance at a Mass which is celebrated anywhere in a Catholic rite either on the holy day or on the evening of the preceding day." (CCC 2180) The next **holy day of obligation** is **August 15**, the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.
