I am hard working and dedicated to delivering high quality holistic assessment and intervention for individuals with complex symptoms using up to date evidence, client centred principles and core occupational therapy skills. I am extremely passionate about occupational therapy and the difference occupational therapists can make to peoples' lives.

A dual clinical/leadership role within the Wellbeing Centre to manage and develop Day Care services, the Physiotherapy/Occupational Therapy team, Complementary therapy, Lymphoedema service and Counselling/Bereavement support team. Clinical work includes specialist occupational therapy assessment and intervention in relation to physical/cognitive function, symptom management and vocational rehabilitation for individuals diagnosed with complex life-limiting conditions inclusive of Cancer, Neurological conditions, and Respiratory conditions — as an in-patient, out-patient or within the person's home environment.

Lead and clinical practitioner for one of three care networks in the local community delivering nursing, occupational therapy and physiotherapy for adults; including the housing and major adaptations team and end of life care/specialist palliative care teams. The role varied from one to one work and working closely with the core therapy rehabilitation team to assess and deliver intervention (inclusive of equipment and recommendations for housing adaptations) for patients within their community home, local hospice and acute services to sharing the value of occupational therapy on a national scale through conferences, charitable events and fundraising opportunities.
