Notes from the Horticulture Committee...

Spring is a good time to rejuvinate old, woody shrubs. Do you have a sage (or two) that has seen better days in your Section? If done correctly every 4-5 years, some of our shurbs can be cut back to 8-12 inches above the ground. This removes old wood that is no longer attractive because it no longer is producing leaves and flowers. This radical pruning allows fresh new growth on older plants. This is called rejunivation pruning. Be careful, only certain plants will respond well to rejuvination pruning.

You may use rejuvination pruning on specific plants in the spring preferrably before the end of March. If we encourage new growth by pruning too close to the summer months all of the new little leaves burn up.

Use loppers or pruning saws for clean cuts for this work. Do not shears which damage the plant stems and branches. Torn bark and ragged cuts make easy access for disease and pests.

Notes from the Horticulture Committee continued...

Rejuvination pruning is only appropriate for some plants at specific times of the year. Right now, before it gets too hot, Lantana, Sage, Dalea, grasses (better in late winter), Chuparosa, Turpentine Bush, Fairy Duster, Bush Morning Glory, Emu, Oleander, and Brittle Bush may be rejuvinated. Some of our other plants should be cut back in the fall or winter. Stay tuned for more info next September. ALWAYS check with your monitor before pruning any plant and NEVER Prune (RAAY) Ruellia, Aloes, Agaves, Yucccas!
