#### From the Horticulture Team

March is a great time to prune these plants.: Lantana, Bougainvillea, Little John Bottle Brush, Natal Plum, Fairy Dusters (it may be too late if they are in full bloom), Yellow Bells, and Orange Bells.

Pruning is not shearing. Pruning means to take off individual brances or shoots to shape the plant but keep it looking natural. Also to remove any woody or dead branches.

Never prune a plant that is blooming. For more information on pruning timing, <u>click</u> here.

Never prune agaves, yuccas, or aloes.

## **Monitor's Corner**

Now is the time to begin planning for spring planting. Plant request sheets are available in the garage.

- Use the plants which are found in our Approved Plant List
- Be sure you have the correct amount of space for the *mature* size of the plant. By considering the mature plant size you will not have to do unnecessay pruning to keep the plant unnaturally small.
- Check the location you are planning to plant. Is there working irrigation? If not contact Mike Radtke. Plants should NEVER be planted where there is not irrigation. Most plants simply cannot survivie the summer without supplemental water.
- Planting should begin by March 18. We will switch to the summer watering program at that time so newly installed plants will have more frequent water.

### Plant of the Month

Valentine Emu Bush Eremophila maculata 'Valentine"



The Valentine Emu Bush will grow to 4 ft. high by 5 ft. wide and produces red tubular flowers from winter to early spring. The leaves are tinged red in winter. This is an excellent choice for our medians or home landscaping that needs some winter color. It has showy red-rose blooms that cover the foliage, is hardy to 15 degrees, is extremely drought tolerant, and does well in full sun.

Plant the Valentine bush in well drained soil and allow to dry out between watering. Plant in a space that needs winter color. It will be a striking contrast to other vde splants.

When this plant is given room to spread and grow to it's mature size it will not require pruning and will be spectatucluar in winter. A light shearing in late spring, after blooming, will increase blooms since flowering will appear on new tip growth.
