Pastor's Ponderings

Happy Easter! As we celebrated Easter Sunday, we were reminded that Easter isn't just a day – it's a whole season, 7 weeks long, when we're reminded of the joy and life that Jesus brings us through his resurrection.

As many of you know, after serving here at Grace for 7 years, I'm going to be on Sabbatical this summer. I'm blessed and humbled by this opportunity, as well as by the Lilly Clergy Renewal Grant we were given to support my sabbatical plans and to support Grace during our sabbatical summer. While I'm the one who will be away, instead of thinking about this as my summer of renewal and reflection, I want us to think about this as our summer of renewal and reflection, for Grace and for myself. It's a wonderful opportunity for us to reflect on who we are as people of God and as the community of Grace. How has God worked through us in the past few years? How is God calling us to serve in the future?

I've got a wonderful Sabbatical Team who helped with my grant application and will help shape this summer of renewal and reflection for Grace. Together, we created themes for each month of my Sabbatical – Recreation, Engagement, and Reflection. Those themes will be paralleled by the activities here at Grace, and the Sabbatical Team will be working on that. I want to share part of what they wrote on the grant application to express how this will be a shared experience:

The congregation will participate in a parallel program of Recreation, Engagement, and Reflection. The benefits of the sabbatical leave should be readily apparent to all of us. By summer's end, when Pastor Jelinek returns to Grace to resume her pastoral roles, we will surely find her renewed and refreshed (and ready once again to cook for us and to offer us thoughtful new dramatic skits to stimulate our worship experiences); likewise, she will find us prepared to eat, engage, and reflect as we go forward together in Christ as a revitalized church family.

Also, while I'm away, you'll be lovingly served by Pastors Loren and Linda Schumacher, wonderful bridge pastors who are very familiar with the Cambridge area. This year's Lenten Challenge was the ELCA's AMMPARO project (Accompanying Migrants with Protection, Advocacy, Representation and Opportunities). AMMPARO's



mission includes providing aide to people coming to the United States who are fleeing crime and violence, extreme poverty, environmental displacement, and lack of opportunities. More than half of them are now from countries outside of the Americas. AMMPARO assists new migrants arriving here, and also those who have been deported after years in the

US, providing job training once back in their home country.

Thanks to your generosity, we exceeded out Lenten goal to raise \$2000 before Easter! Monies raised will go directly to AMMPARO to help fund their programs.

GRACE LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

March 12, 2024

(Minutes will be reviewed & approved at next Council meeting)

Call to Order. President Kelly Witte called the meeting to order at 7:15 pm.

Attendance. Present: Pr. Jennifer Jelinek, Connie Kreuser, Charlene Luchterhand, April Mickelson, Peggy Punsel, Kristin Rue, Richard Scott, Amy Simdon, Shawn Whitman, Kelly Witte. **Absent:** Sandi Aston Hall, John Jensen, Bob Koepp

Devotions. Amy shared devotions.

Approval Minutes. Peggy moved and Amy seconded a motion to add the topic of Cambridge High School T-shirt Sponsorship Request to New Business. Amended agenda unanimously approved.

Approval of Agenda. Several people suggested additions or slight revisions: 1) Add Pr. Jennifer's sabbatical to Old Business. 2) Add the need for a change in signers on bank accounts and the ELCA Mission Investment Fund to New Business. 3) Move the topic of a pollinator garden earlier in the meeting to allow the participating non-Council member to leave after her presentation. Peggy Punsel moved and Sandi Aston Hall seconded a motion to approve the amended agenda. Motion unanimously approved.

Correspondence. None.

Treasurer's Report. (Amy) \$7500 was placed in a 7-month CD. We had a net loss of \$6,657 in February, mainly due to sabbatical expenses. Our year-to-date (YTD) General Giving at the end of February was \$9,049 higher than 2023 and \$4,300 over the YTD budget. YTD Special Giving was \$282 more than last year and almost \$600 more than the monthly budget. YTD expenses were \$14,775 more than last year and just over \$1,100 over our budget. The biggest jump in expenses was due to those paid for Pastor's upcoming sabbatical (\$9,290) with these funds coming from her sabbatical grant. YTD net ordinary income would be about \$9,880 if we didn't include the sabbatical grant or expenses, about \$4,800 more than last year at the end of February. The checking balance decreased by almost \$6,200 with the general fund balance staying flat. Char moved to approve this report and send it to audit. Kristin seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.

Pastor's Report. (Pr. Jennifer) Lent is moving along as planned. As usual, there will be an ecumenical service in the park on Good Friday at noon. We no longer have the cross used in that service and in our chancel. Neil Johnson has built a new one, which can be more readily held in place and stored. Pastor will be attending the Institute of Liturgical Studies conference at Valparaiso University on April 9-11. Shauna Thayer has been added to the sabbatical team. Meetings will begin shortly. We are down to the wire with fund-raising for the youth gathering beginning July 15 in New Orleans. Six youth plan to attend.

Committee Reports. (Provided in writing and/or discussed in the meeting as needed.)

• Education. (Kristin) See New Business.

Outreach & Social Justice. (April) With donations totaling \$867.50, we are almost halfway to reaching our Lenten challenge goal of \$2000 designated for the ELCA's AMMPARO initiative, which provides a caring presence and assistance to migrants.

Property. (Richard) See "Front Door Bids" in Old Business.

Stewardship. (Connie) Committee chairs are encouraged to review time/talent surveys for new members. And members are encouraged to contact committee chairs if interested, but not contacted. Also see "Pollinator Garden" in Old Business.

Worship. (Sandi) Holy week worship service times: Palm Sunday 9:00 AM, Maundy Thursday 7:00 PM, Good Friday 7:00 PM Tenebrae, Easter 7:00 AM & 9:00 AM. Easter flowers can be ordered through 3/13. Easter decorating will occur the Saturday prior.

Old Business.

- Front Door Richard, along with John Jensen and Dale Klemp, sought 3 bids. They recommend accepting the bid from Jefferson Glass totaling \$16,260, citing a combination of cost and responsiveness of the company for their decision. There are two components: 1) the ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act) compliant doors and 2) the automatic openers. Jefferson Glass will do all work except needed wiring. We will be able to continue using our current keys. Council discussed optimal placement of automatic openers. Council members are excited about this planned welcoming and functional improvement to our building. Amy moved to accept the bid and take the issue to the congregation for approval. April seconded the motion. Unanimously approved. Char moved to call a brief congregational meeting following the April 7 worship service. Kristin seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.
- **Pollinator Garden.** Stewardship Committee member Mary Bielefeldt provided an update, as we viewed sites. Diggers Hotline inspected both proposed locations. The site near the road was not selected because of buried utility lines and tree roots. The project will move forward in the site on the north side of the church where the large windows are located. The garden will be moved slightly west from the current stakes, anticipating the shade that will be provided by the future growth of the evergreen tree. The garden will be re-staked and Diggers Hotline contacted again closer to the time planting will occur.

New Business.

Easter Sunday School/Community Event. (Kristin) The Easter egg hunt occurring this coming Sunday was originally planned as a community event. Because that is also spring break for local schools, the community aspect will be postponed until next year. This event therefore will be for our own church youth, with other children welcome if they happen to come. Hospitality Committee (Peggy and family) will provide a small lunch for participating kids at 11:30 AM.

Insurance Policy. (Kristin) Our Church Mutual Insurance Company policy expires on 6-2-24. The current policy allows us to offer one off-site event (e.g., vacation Bible school) per year. If we want to offer more events off-site, we will need additional insurance coverage. We need to seek additional information from the company regarding what constitutes "one off-site event." For example, is a multi-day program considered one event? Or is each day considered a separate event? It was suggested that Catherine Elliott and/or Breah Klemp could explore this further.

Cambridge High School T-shirt Sponsorship Request. (Pastor) Council chose not to provide funds to sponsor t-shirts as part of the fall sports season at the high school.

Adjournment. Amy moved to adjourn the meeting. Richard seconded the motion. Unanimously approved. We ended with the Lord's Prayer.

Next Meeting. Our next meeting will be held one week later than usual (so Pastor can attend) on Tuesday, April 16 at 7:00 PM. April will present devotions.




