We have been copastors over the past 44 years. We first served as interim Pastors at a two-point parish in Merrimac/Mazomanie, WI. Our first call was at Christ Lutheran in Paddock Lake, WI. From there we served a two-point parish in Curtiss/Medford, WI, a rural congregation in Amery, WI, and finally a congregation in Cloquet, MN. We retired from active ministry in August of 2017 and moved to Madison. We have two children, a daughter in Georgia and a



son in Madison. We have always worked together sharing our calling in Ministry. Since moving to Madison we have served as interim pastors at Spring Prairie, Springdale/West Blue Mounds, East Koshkonong, and Rockdale Lutheran. We look forward to our time with Grace while Pastor Jennifer is on Sabbatical.

In other Jelinek family news, after 14 years of dealing with lung cancer and various treatments, metastases, and challenges, my husband, Pastor Erik Jelinek, has decided to go on Disability. His last Sunday at Central Lutheran Church will be May 19. 


Kids Take Over Worship Service: May 5th

GRACE LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

April 16, 2024

(Minutes below reviewed & approved at next Council meeting)

Call to Order. Vice President Bob Koepp called the meeting to order at 7:03 PM.

Attendance. Present: Sandi Aston Hall, Pr. Jennifer Jelinek, John Jensen, Bob Koepp, Connie Kreuser, Charlene Luchterhand, April Mickelson, Peggy Punsel, Kristin Rue, Richard Scott, Amy Simdon, Shawn Whitman. **Absent:** Kelly Witte

Devotions. April shared devotions.

Approval of Minutes. Amy moved to approve the minutes from the special congregational meeting held on April 7. John seconded the motion. Unanimously approved. April moved to approve the March meeting minutes. Shawn seconded the motion. Approved with abstentions from those not present in March.

Approval of Agenda. Sandi moved to approve the agenda. Kristin seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.

Correspondence.

Lutherdale invites us to participate in their 80th year celebration on Saturday, April 20th. UW-Madison Lutheran Campus Ministry is hosting an Open House on Sunday afternoon, April 21st.

Treasurer's Report. (Amy) We had a net gain of \$12,926.94 in March. Our year-to-date General Giving at the end of March was \$10,484 higher than 2023 and \$13,363 over the YTD budget. Year-to-date Special Giving was \$962 more than last year and over \$3,000 more than budget. Our year -to-date expenses were \$12,753 more than last year (due to sabbatical & youth gathering expenses) however we are almost \$4,500 under our budget. Year-to-date net ordinary income would be about \$22,831 if the sabbatical grant and expenses are not included. This is about \$8,500 more than last year at the end of March. The checking balance increased by about \$460 with the general fund balance decreasing by approximately \$4,000. The ELCA Mission Investment Fund (pastoral housing allowance) was moved to a five-year rather than annual renewal, which will increase interest amounts.

Pastor's Report. (Pr. Jennifer) Lent and Easter services went well. There will be a wedding this coming Saturday—the Kilburg family. Pastor will post a sign-up sheet for people who have keys to open and lock the church on Sundays during her sabbatical this summer.

Committee Reports. (Provided in writing and/or discussed in the meeting as needed.)

Education. (Kristin) Sunday School students will lead the worship service on May 5th. This will also be the last day of Sunday School for the semester. Vacation Bible School will be held July 15-19 at Cambridge Elementary School. Volunteers are needed to help with planning.

Those interested should contact Breah Klemp. Planning is underway to paint the downstairs Sunday School area this summer. Quilters will be asked if interested in sewing new valances for the classrooms.

Property. (Richard and John) See "Front Door Project" in Old Business.

Stewardship. (Connie) See "Pollinator Garden" in Old Business.

Old Business.

Front Door Project. Final front door measurements were taken one week ago. It will be a two-day project. It is four-to-five weeks out. Council determined about half of the financing will come from the budget and the other half from fund-raising. A variety of fund-raising options were discussed. Connie, April, and Kristin will coordinate fund-raising efforts.

Pollinator Garden. Diggers Hotline has checked the proposed planting area. Appropriate plants are being identified. The goal is to prepare the ground and plant sometime in May. Connie secured a \$250 Thrivent Grant, which will be used for mulch and/or plants.

Insurance Policy. Topic tabled. Policy will renew automatically.

New Business.



Adjournment. Amy moved to adjourn the meeting. Sandi seconded the motion. Unanimously approved. Meeting adjourned at 8:20 PM. We ended with the Lord's Prayer.

Next Meeting. Our next meeting will be held on Tuesday, May 14 at 7:00 PM. Kelly is scheduled to present devotions.




