Mike's Musings

Sometimes it is hard to be a Christian. No... that is wrong, most of the time it's hard to be a Christian. You may ask me why I say that. This is my answer. The Pharisees asked a question of Jesus to try and get Him to say something they could trap Him

with. The asked what was the greatest commandment? His answer is found in Matthew 22:37-40 which says, "Jesus replied: 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments."

You might ask, how does this scripture make it hard to be a Christian? "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, and all your soul, and all your mind." I asked myself this and came up lacking. I love myself more sometimes. I'm sure if you are honest with yourself you have to say you love yourself more too. I have to then ask myself how I change. The only answer I can come up with is to ask for help to put God first. God has given us the Holy Spirit. He has also given us His word. In Ephesians 6:13-19 it says, "Therefore put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the Lord's people."

Be merciful to those who doubt; save others by snatching them from the fire; to others show mercy, mixed with fear—hating even the clothing stained by corrupted flesh."

...From Whom All Blessings Flow

I have a little plastic gourd in my office that has engraved on it this statement; "*Praise God* from whom all blessings flow." The statement is short and succinct but what does it really mean. I wanted to break down this statement briefly. I think it is abundantly clear that we should praise God. 1 Thess. 5:18 says to "give thanks in all circumstances" which would be synonymous with praising God because the intended recipient in the text is God the Father. So, whenever we think of God or recognize God in life's situations, we ought to give praise to Him. This is very easy to do when life is good, when the sun is shining on our soul, and crisis or tragedy has been averted. It is much harder when life is difficult, and sadness and heartache are at the forefront.

So how do we do what the phrase suggests we do? "Praise God from whom all blessings flow." "From whom" directs us to who the source is. The source is God even if the blessing is received from a person. "All" is an important word. The context usually means all (100%) like in this case! We may say something like "they all loved it" meaning a huge majority, not necessarily all. Why do I differentiate? Because I believe 100% is the intended meaning when we shared the text from 1 Thess. and I also believe the doxology we have quoted means the following phrase originates from God 100% of the time.

The last piece of that phrase is "Praise God from whom all <u>blessings flow."</u> Maybe it's hard for us to define blessings. Sometimes they are in plain sight, and we can immediately recognize them and give God the glory. Sometimes they are disguised and not recognized until a period of time has transpired. Think of Jesus's death on the cross for example. The disciples saw it as a curse at first, but after the resurrection realized the blessing was atonement for their sins. What I am not saying is that everything that happens is a blessing (that is absolutely not true). Many things happen at the hand of Satan and that is not a blessing, but God can take the awful intent of Satan and bring out of it a blessing in time. "All things work together for good to those who love him (God)" Rom 8:28

So let God work and praise him from whom all blessings flow. He will bring blessings out of great things and horrible things over time. Just trust and obey for there is no other way (the old hymn). Love you all,
