This year we have the rare instance of Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday happening on the same date, February 14th, which creates a dilemma. All the trappings of Valentine's Day, such as chocolates, a nice steak, or a glass of wine, are on the list of things we give up for Lent.

Perhaps this year, we can recognize both our valentines and our duties to the Penitential season a little differently. 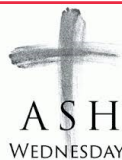
