Purpose and Goals

To provide opportunities that enhance the learning of our four-year-old students by exploring fun educational activities. In addition, we work to build the child's self-confidence through our planned activities. We use the Creative Curriculum and the Ohio Early Learning Content Standards to develop lessons aligned with the Common Core Curriculum.

The Owl class is for children eligible to attend Kindergarten the following fall. We work on executive function skills to help the child be prepared for their first year in elementary school.

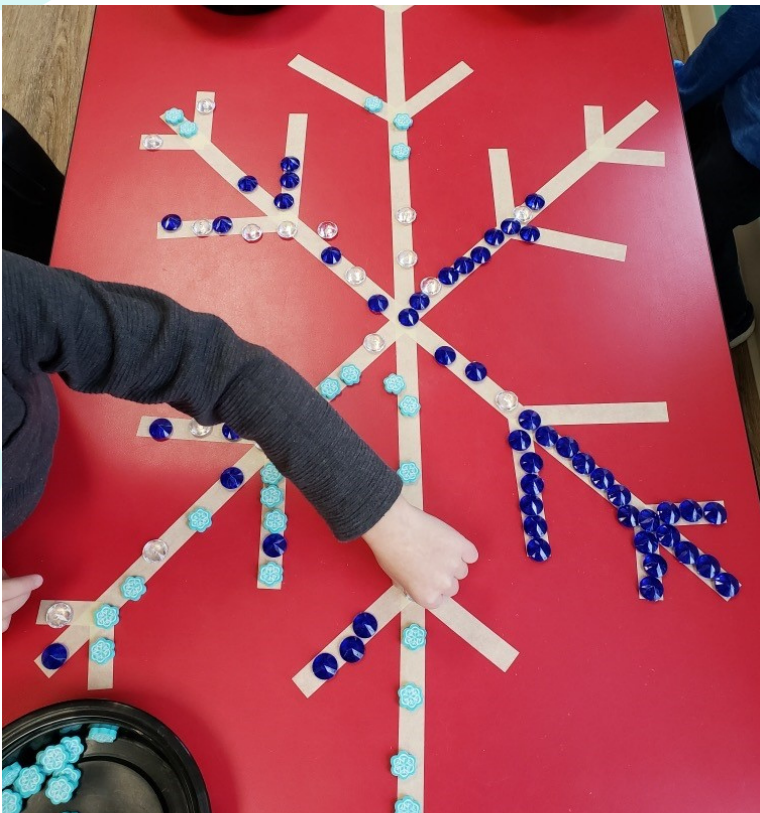
Owl PM Class:

Owl Treehouse Class

Our Enrichment class for four-year-old children is called Owl Treehouse. In this class, the children extend their lessons from the Owl classes. The teachers spend extra time working with students on concepts and activities from earlier in the week. The class focuses on writing numbers and weekly Bible stories and science experiments. The children engage in more social and center time to foster their love for learning while allowing them to get used to experiencing four days a week at school.

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
