

WHAT IS THE MARINE CORPS LEAGUE?

Members of the Marine Corps League join together in camaraderie and fellowship for the purpose of preserving the traditions and promoting the interests of the United States Marine Corps, banding together those who are now serving in the United States Marine Corps those who have been honorably discharged from that service that they may effectively promote the ideals of American freedom and democracy, voluntarily aiding and rendering assistance to all Marines and former Marines and to their widows and orphans; and to perpetuate the history of the United States Marine Corps and by fitting acts to observe the anniversaries of historical occasions particular interest to Marines.

CHARTERS

The West Central Illinois Leathernecks detachment and Auxiliary unit are located in Illinois. The Jacksonville. detachment's Charter was signed on July 24, 2004, and the Charter Ceremony, Initiation of Members, and Installation of Officers were held on October 14, 2004 with then Department of Illinois Commandant Allen Ruble presiding. The detachment celebrated its 10th anniversary with a dinner in October, 2014 and in 2019 completed 15 years as a detachment. Auxiliary unit received its Charter in a ceremony on April 1, 2006 with then Department of Illinois President Vi Eggert presiding.



West Central Illinois Leathernecks The detachment and unit have always worked closely together in support of the principles of the Marine Corps League and Marine Corps League Auxiliary. We have held several annual fundraising events: a Raffle for the choice of a rifle, pistol, or \$500 cash; a Traffic Stop where we solicited donations and offered American flag decals (not held since 2015 due to a lack of participation); and, for eleven years, we held a Dice Run for boaters on Lake Jacksonville with music provided by a DJ. It was discontinued in 2016 due to a lack of available help. Our Traffic Stop ended in 2016 for the same reason.

A chili cook-off and auction were held in October 2010 which realized over \$8000 for Land of Lincoln Honor Flight. The unit members have also sold two cookbooks as fundraisers. In 2015, we also sponsored a Trivia Night to assist the family of Jacob Crosier with funeral expenses and raised over \$6000. We also held a Trivia Night in 2016.

Currently, our only fundraiser is an annual raffle with three prizes awarded. We have been able to continue to provide financial support to very worthy veterans' causes using the proceeds of this raffle.



MERRY CHRISTMAS, MY FRIEND

'Twas the night before Christmas, he lived all alone, In a one-bedroom house made of plaster and stone. I had come down the chimney, with presents to give and to see just who in this home did live.

As I looked all about, a strange sight I did see, no tinsel, no presents, not even a tree. No stocking by the fire, just boots filled with sand. On the wall hung pictures of a far distant land.

With medals and badges, awards of all kind, a sobering thought soon came to my mind. For this house was different, unlike any I'd seen. This was the home of a U.S. Marine.

I'd heard stories about them, I had to see more, so I walked down the hall and pushed open the door.

And there he lay sleeping, silent, alone,
Curled up on the floor in his one-bedroom home.

He seemed so gentle, his face so serene, Not how I pictured a U.S. Marine. Was this the hero, of whom I'd just read? Curled up in his poncho, a floor for his bed?

His head was clean-shaven, his weathered face tan. I soon understood, this was more than a man. For I realized the families that I saw that night, owed their lives to these men, who were willing to fight.

Soon around the Nation, the children would play, And grown-ups would celebrate on a bright Christmas day.

They all enjoyed freedom, each month and all year, because of Marines like this one lying here.

I couldn't help wonder how many lay alone, on a cold Christmas Eve, in a land far from home. Just the very thought brought a tear to my eye. I dropped to my knees and I started to cry.

He must have awoken, for I heard a rough voice, "Santa, don't cry, this life is my choice I fight for freedom, I don't ask for more. My life is my God, my country, my Corps."

With that he rolled over, drifted off into sleep, I couldn't control it, I continued to weep.

I watched him for hours, so silent and still.
I noticed he shivered from the cold night's chill.
So I took off my jacket, the one made of red,
and covered this Marine from his toes to his head.
Then I put on his T-shirt of scarlet and gold,
with an eagle, globe and anchor emblazoned so bold.
And although it barely fit me, I began to swell with
pride,

and for one shining moment, I was Marine Corps deep

I didn't want to leave him so quiet in the night, this guardian of honor so willing to fight. But half asleep he rolled over, and in a voice clean and pure,

said "Carry on, Santa, it's Christmas Day, all secure."
One look at my watch and I knew he was right,
Merry Christmas my friend, Semper Fi and goodnight.

Note:

Written by James M. Schmidt in 1986 when he was a Lance Corporal stated at Marine Barracks, Washington, D.C. In December 2002, Mr. Schmidt stated that in 1986 he wrote this poem to hang on the door of the gym in the enlisted quarters. When his commanding officer saw the poem, he immediately had copies sent throughout the Barracks, and promptly dismissed the entire Battalion early for Christmas leave.

The same day, poem was enclosed in the *Marine Corps Gazette*, distributed worldwide, and was later printed on page 79 in the December 1991 issue of "Leatherneck," which in 2003 gave this explanation:

"'Merry Christmas, My Friend," has been a holiday favorite among 'leatherneckphiles' for nearly the time it takes to complete a Marine Corps career. Few, however, know who wrote it and when. Former Corporal James M. Schmidt, stationed at Marine Barracks, Washington, D.C., pounded it out over 17 years ago on a typewriter while awaiting the commanding officer's Christmas holiday decorations inspection...while other leathernecks strung lights for the Barracks' annual Christmas decoration contest, Schmidt contributed his poem to his section."

With a slight change of wording, the poem has become known as "A Soldier's Silent Night," and was recorded under that title by Father Ted Berndt as a tribute. Berndt was a World War II Marine veteran and recipient of the Purple Heart. At the time of the recording in late 2003, Father Berndt was a priest at Bread of Life Charismatic Episcopal Church in Dousman, Wisconsin. He died March 19, 2004. The poem was recorded in one take. The recording received a national A.I.R. (Achievement in Radio) award from the March of Dimes.
