Thames Marina Wins. Shepperton Marina, on the River Thames, has been announced as the top UK inland waterway for 2022 by The Yacht Harbour Association. The runner-up is Campbell Wharf Marina, on the Grand Union Canal at Milton Keynes. The awards are open to THYA member marinas, and voted on by the berth holders.

CRT Fees To Rise. Spare a thought for the canal boaters as the CRT have announced that boat Licence fees will rise by 9% as from 1 Apr 2023 whereas the EA have only raised their fees by 4%.
