

CARA Meeting Minutes for October 8, 2010

Since I had to leave the meeting early, these minutes are in two parts. I am reporting on the first part of the meeting and Barry, KA1JDD, picked up after the break.

The meeting was called to order by CARA President Harlan Ford, W1QH, with 19 members and guests present. Carl Braun, W1ZGZ, brought a guest, Charlie Russell, KB1UOH, who is a newly re-licensed ham from Thomaston. Welcome to Charlie and thanks to Carl for bringing him to our meeting.

This was not a regular meeting. A club such as ours benefits greatly from everyone's efforts and at this get together we gave special thanks to two of our members, Frank Etzler, N8WXQ, and his wife Judy, N1TGK who have been extremely active in the operation of the Candlewood Amateur Radio Association for many years.

Along with Certificates of Appreciation, we presented a Scheunemann Morse Dirigent CW key to Frank and a 10 inch, Reed&Barton, Revere-style silverplate bowl to Judy. Club President Harlan Ford, W1QH, made the presentations. The Certificates outline their contributions to CARA and are shown elsewhere in this issue of the Capers.

Again we thank Frank and Judy for their past support of CARA functions and look forward to their future work.

As a matter of fact, immediately after the presentation, Frank gave the program for the evening on High Frequency radio propagation computer software that is available to the Amateur Radio community!

During his program Frank reviewed the various layers of the ionosphere and how they affect the VLF, LF, MF, HF, VHF and UHF bands that we operate on. He further listed factors that influence the ionosphere: solar flux (sun spots), season of the year (length of day and night & sun location), time of day and X-ray and proton flux (ionospheric weather). Finally he demonstrated one of the computer programs used for determining the best band to use in a given situation, VOACAP. The program is available at www.voacap.com. I went to the website and found that "VOACAP" is the Voice of America Coverage Analysis Program and it looks like you could spend days perusing its features.

Thanks to Frank for another fine program and we look forward to many more.

Before leaving I got the report of \$11,675.42 from Bill Webb, W1AFX, Treasurer. This includes \$1,892.46 from the Hamfest.

- Checked feedlines. Ten years old but vendor says good for 20+
- Brought down 2M folded dipole for maintenance
- Swapped out replacement 2M antenna
- o 440 amplifier is out for repair
- Moved 2M repeater inside box where more room; cleaned up area

- 6M repeater tested. Output is 25 Watts
- 220 repeater is fixed but not yet re-installed
- Placed new final amp in 2M repeater
- Removed dead backup batteries
- Re-tarred sections of the roof that were leaking water

There is also a major commemorative motorcycle event that day that will bring hundreds of riders past Edmond Town Hall during the day.

It was noted by Harlan that 2011 is the 80th anniversary of CARA and that some special event should be considered to mark the event. Further discussion to follow.

Joe AB1DO suggested, in view of the healthy treasury balance, that the club consider either waiving the dues for members in 2011 or reducing the amount as low as our charter will allow. The matter will be discussed further and voted on at the November meeting.

ARLD042 Dissolution of Netherlands Antilles Creates Four New DXCC Entities The dissolution of the Netherlands Antilles has caused changes to the DXCC List. As per the DXCC rules, the two Netherlands Antilles DXCC entities will be deleted and moved to the Deleted Entities List.

Four new entities will be added to the DXCC List: (1) Curacao; (2) Sint Maarten; (3) Saba and St Eustatius, and (4) Bonaire.

The event date and time for these changes was 0400 UTC, October 10, 2010.

Confirmations for these new entities will be accepted for credit starting January 1, 2011. Other administrative changes and actions will be announced as they are finalized.
