CARA Meeting Minutes for November

The meeting was called to order by the club president, Harlan, W1QH, at 8:00 p.m.

There were 19 members present. Ken, KD1DD, had a display of used ham gear for sale set up on a table to the rear of the meeting room.

Harlan introduced our guest speaker, Scott, NE1RD, who presented a program entitled "The 100 lb DXpedition." Scott's presentation centered on planning and carrying out fun -but budget-conscious, lowweight—DXpeditions to "reasonable" locations. Scott likes to build his own gear and antennas, and assembles them with a view toward packing them for easy transport as airport baggage items. His antennas, for example, are constructed in modular fashion to fit in a golf bag travel case. He often combines his DXpeditions with a family vacation, and he described in his presentation a recent trip with his wife to a rental home on the island of St. Thomas. Scott often "scouts" his locations in advance using Google earth, and tries to combine his DXpeditions to coincide with a significant contest so he's assured of a lot of band activity. Scott emphasized that it was important to (1) Plan ahead and know your goals; (2) Test all your gear beforehand; (3) Understand the tradeoffs you will need to make in terms of antenna, transmit power; (4) Allow for rest periods and to have fun.

Some other tips for success: Never be afraid to call CQ even on lower power. If the other station can hear you they have no idea you are QRP. Respond promptly with QSL cards either hardcopy or via eQSL, ARRL Logbook of the World etc.

Thanks, Scott, for a presentation as well-planned and executed as your DXpeditions!

Treasurer's Report: Bill W1AFX reported the treasury balance as \$10,811.87. A motion made at last month's meeting by Joe, AB1DO, to suspend dues for calendar year 2011, was withdrawn, due to some unexpected club expenses regarding the repeaters. A special budget meeting will be scheduled after Thanksgiving.

Repeater Committee: Ken, KD1DD, reported that he and Bill N1TIW had traveled to the repeater site. Repairs and adjustments were made to several repeaters, but there are filter tuning issues that need to be resolved and which may require additional expense. A new controller has been installed and programmed. The backup battery is dead and a new battery is available but weighs 150 pounds and will require some method of transport for it to be installed.

Dan W1QK discussed a special event station in conjunction with the NE QSO Party. Ken KD1DD recommended Bennett Park in Bethel for the site and noted that a town permit would be required. Dan agreed to be on the committee but other members' help also is needed to plan the event. KD1YV and KA1JDD offered to help. A QSL card and/or certificate would also be needed. The date of Saturday, May 7, 2011, was proposed.

There was some discussion about the installation of a 2-meter transceiver and antenna at the Stony Hill Fire Station. A secure operating position is being sought that would be accessible to area hams as needed.

Plans for the Annual Holiday Party were discussed. Those planning to attend and bring a dish to share are asked to contact Joe AB1DO, who has agreed to maintain a list of items.

There also will be a holiday "grab bag" – bring a gift, take a gift – in the \$10-\$15 range.

Finally, there was closing discussion about the reflector, and a reminder about recommended operating procedure.

The meeting was adjourned at 10 p.m.
