May 13, 2011 CARA Meeting Minutes

The meeting was called to order by CARA President Harlan Ford, W1QH, with 19 members and guests present.

The program for the evening was a presentation by Harlan, W1QH, and Dan, W1QK, of their construction and operation of two Elecraft Transverters, the Model XV222 and the Model XV432. These units allow the use of an HF transceiver in the 222 MHz and 432 MHz bands.

Their talk, complete with comments on the construction and audio that was recorded during operation of the completed units, was a good introduction to transverters.

Not being that familiar with transverters I took a look at the Elcraft and Downeast Microwave websites. The Elcraft site had some interesting comments by users about modifications they did to improve operations in their specific situations. The DEMI site had a good talk-through on how to work a transverter into your transceiver and style of station operation.

Our thanks to Dan and Harlan for a useful program on how to add bands without having to add more transceivers.

After a short break we went on to the business part of the meeting.

The minutes of the April meeting, as published in the Capers, were accepted.

The Treasurer's report of \$10,345.27 was accepted.

This year CARA operated two stations during the May 8, 2011 NEQSO Party.

First of all we operated W1AW from ARRL Headquarters in Newington, CT. We do this every year and this time the participants were Frank, N8WXQ, Roger, KB1NYY, Gene, KL7CE, and John, W1JMA.

During the same time period we also operated a Special Event Station celebrating CARA's 80th Anniversary. Using the club callsign W1QI, Roger, NG1R, Harlan, W1QH, and Dan, W1QK, operated from Dan's home QTH in Brookfield.

The results of these two events will be reported later.

According to Field Day co-chairman Bill, N1PJG, preparations are on schedule. Sign-up sheets for operating times will be available at our June 10 meeting.

The election of club officers will be held at the June 10 meeting and the nominating committee, Gene, KL7CE, and Roger, KB1NYY, has submitted the following slate.

FEMA Administrator Calls Amateur Radio "The Last Line of Defense"

In an <u>FCC forum</u> on earthquake communications preparedness, Federal Emergency Management Agency (<u>FEMA</u>) Administrator Craig Fugate described the

Amateur Radio operator as "the ultimate backup, the originators of what we call social media." The forum-- held May 3 at FCC Headquarters in Washington, DC -- brought together officials from the White House, the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), the United States Geological Survey (USGS), FEMA, the FCC and the private sector. Fugate and FCC Bureau of Public Safety and Homeland Security Chief Jamie Barnett gave the opening remarks.



In an earthquake communications preparedness forum sponsored by the FCC, FEMA Administrator Craig Fugate praised Amateur Radio, saying "...when you need Amateur Radio, you really need it."

Later in the forum, Fugate spoke more on Amateur Radio. "During the initial communications out of Haiti, volunteers using assigned frequencies that they are allocated, their own equipment, their own money, nobody pays them, were the first ones oftentimes getting word out in the critical first hours and first days as the rest of the systems came back up," he told the forum. "I think that there is a tendency because we have done so much to build infrastructure and resiliency in all our other systems, we have tended to dismiss that role "When Everything Else Fails.' Amateur Radio oftentimes is our last line of defense."

Fugate said that he thinks "we get so sophisticated and we have gotten so used to the reliability and resilience in our wireless and wired and our broadcast industry and all of our public safety communications, that we can never fathom that they'll fail. They do. They have. They will. I think a strong Amateur Radio community [needs to be] plugged into these plans. Yes, most of the time they're going be bored, because a lot of the time, there's not a lot they're going to be doing that other people aren't doing with Twitter and Facebook and everything else. But when you need Amateur Radio, you really need them."
