The new CARA Yaesu System Fusion DR-2X CARA 70Cm repeater has been relocated and is now operational from the Spruce mountain site as of Tuesday (10/2) afternoon. The team consisted of Marcus – AB1WV, Gregory – WR1Z. Thank you both for your contribution of your time and talents to complete this task. Thank you to John – W1JGM and Gregory – WR1Z for your efforts in preparing the repeater for this move.

This was done to allow coverage to the south. The repeater is in standalone mode, therefore, there's no courtesy tone, and the squelch tail is very short.

In addition, the CARA 70Cm and 2M repeaters have been linked to the NARA repeater system, to provide coverage for the 2018 ARRL ARES SET test, which was held on October 6. This enabled coverage for a greater part of Region 5.

The repeater output frequency is 447.775 Mhz., Minus offset of 5Mhz. PL 100.

Please let us know if you experience any issues. Enjoy and try it out, it will be nice to see the coverage.



NEW HF OPERATORS -- THINGS TO DO If you haven't set up for HF operation yet, Bob, KONR, <u>discusses some of the barriers</u> you might face, as well as ways to overcome them. One of the suggestions is to find a mentor to help you get on the air, which should be the first thing to try.

If you haven't already, give one of the ARRL Sweepstakes Contests (Phone or CW) a try. The CW version can be daunting, with many stations sending the long exchange at 30-plus words per minute. While you can always ask stations to QRS, it can be less stressful to listen for stations that are already sending at a speed you can copy. The best way to get better at CW Sweepstakes is to participate. The <u>ARRL</u> <u>Sweepstakes web page</u> has pointers, and a link to the 2018 Operating Guide that can help to explain some of the nuances of the contest, and why it's a perennial favorite.

Weather has forced an early shutdown of the <u>VP6D Ducie Island DXpedition</u>. The team announced just after 1600 UTC on October 31 that, "due to an expected worsening in landing conditions," it would cease operations. The final contact count was 121,136. Most contacts --67,686 -- were on CW, with 28,736 on SSB, and 24,714 on digital modes. "It's been raining all night, with 20+ knot winds," an October 31 news bulletin from the team said. "The ship is about 300 meters off shore, the forecast indicates continuing 20+ knot winds, 2 - 3 meter seas. We want to thank everyone for their support, and hope we met your expectations."

Dear Fellow Member:

Newington, CT, September 14, 2018

The Charter of our League provides for the government of our affairs by a Board of Directors consisting of one director elected from each of the divisions in the United States. In addition to electing the director, each division has the duty of electing a vice-director, who assumes all the powers of director in the event of death, resignation, or disability of the latter.

In accordance with the By-Laws, an election is now being held in your division to elect a director, and/or a vice-director for a term of three years beginning at noon on January 1, 2019. Enclosed is an official ballot listing nominees in your division, and statements of not more than 300 words prepared by the candidates. The candidate receiving the greatest number of votes, in each case, is to be declared elected.

- 1. Please detach the ballot portion of the card from the address portion along the perforations. If both Director and Vice-Director ballots are included, please separate them from each other and the mailing card. Do not return the address portion of the card.
- 2. Mark your ballot/s by placing an "X" in the box beside the name of the candidate for whom you wish to cast your vote.
- 3. After marking the ballot/s, please insert them in the return envelope provided.
- If there are multiple voting members in the family, please return each person's ballots in their own return envelope. Only one member's vote per envelope please.
- To be valid, the ballot must be received at the Hartford, Connecticut office of the accounting firm of CohnReznick LLP, not later than noon on November
- 16, 2018.
- 6. Ballot envelopes are held unopened at CohnReznick LLP until November 16th.

My professional background consists of more than twenty years as an Information Technology manager, First Selectman (mayor) of my town, service on multiple town boards, almost four years at ARRL running the contest program, and I spent a year as a communications specialist in Antarctica.

I've been licensed since I was 14 years old. My experience includes service in the ARRL Field Organization as an ORS/ traffic handler and Official Observer. I'm an active DXer and contester and served two different terms as president of the Yankee Clipper Contest Club. I've been a competitor and judge at World Radiosport Team Championship events and was the volunteer and site coordinator for WRTC-2014 in the Boston area. I started and continue to run the New England QSO Party. I've served multiple terms as ARRL Director and am currently on the Board's Executive, Historical and Entry Level Licensing Committees. I'm also the President of the ARRL Foundation.

I intend to strongly support these key policy objectives the ARRL is working on today:

 Modernization of the Technician license (digital modes and some SSB on 80-40-15m).

 Federal support for those wanting to install effective antennas in condominiums and neighborhoods with deed restrictions.

 Pushing the FCC to take action on the increasing amount of RF interference and pollution from consumer electronic devices.

FRED HOPENGARTEN, K1VR

I'm running for ARRL New England Division Director. Born and raised in the Boston area, I've been an active ham since 1956, with stops at Colby, BC Law and Harvard Business School. Throughout, the ARRL was there for me; I've been a Life Member since 1975 and Diamond Club-level donor to the League. I wrote Antenna Zoning for the Radio Amateur – in cooperation with the ARRL, and highly-acclaimed. As Volunteer Counsel, I've helped hams around the country get tower permits. I've guided hams throughout our hobby – in EMCOMM, experimenting, contesting, and public service.

In my view, the ARRL Board is not delivering on its historic mission:

Restrictive governance proposals were not shared with the members in advance.

Some top traffic handlers left the ARRL's National Traffic System and formed a competing organization.

The League has spent considerable political capital promoting the Amateur Radio Parity Act, which I see as deeply flawed.

Membership is declining and aging. I believe we can do better at attracting new, younger members, particularly among Technician licensees.

We should embrace greater transparency, become more member-driven, and devote more attention to issues that are critical to the future of our hobby.

Amateur Radio should be a modern, relevant, vibrant and nationally important resource – with new leadership from an enlightened Board that is open and invites membership participation on important issues.

I will use my ham radio and professional background to promote an ARRL that is a healthy and viable organization for the benefit of Amateur Radio. Together, we will chart a new path for the ARRL – an invaluable organization that must succeed if Amateur Radio is to prosper. The Reverend Paul Bittner, WoAIH, of Fall Creek, Wisconsin, died doing what he loved on October 31, when a tower-climbing mishap claimed his life at his well-known <u>antenna farm</u>. The ARRL Life Member and Maxim Society member was 84. A member of the CQ Contesting Hall of Fame and retired Lutheran pastor, Bittner was a well-known and respected figure within the Amateur Radio community and a prolific contester and DXer. His call sign was nearly always present in most major operating events, and even in a few lesser-known contests, and news of his tragic death and condolences and accolades quickly spread among those who knew him best.

"No one was more generous, loving, and encouraging to others than the Reverend Paul Bittner," said Mike Lonneke, W4AAW, in a post to the Potomac Valley Radio Club (PVRC). "He called me last week to chat about what he and Mary were up to, like getting material together for their always long and hilarious Christmas newsletter. He also knocked me out with the latest of his funny experiences in his 'Rent-a-Rev' sideline." Bittner officiated at the June 2 wedding of two well-known midwestern contesters.

Bittner was licensed in 1949 and held the same call sign ever since. He and his wife, Mary, WBoPXM, moved in 2000 to "The Farm," a 120-acre spread in west-central Wisconsin. The first of the more than 50 towers began sprouting there before their arrival in 1982. As a ham, he enjoyed multi-multi contesting and DXing. His favorite band was 160 meters, and his favorite contest was the CQ World Wide DX CW Contest. Bittner's son-in-law — Paul Husby, WOUC — operated VHF contests from The Farm and was a multi-multi regular as well.

"His station stands as a great monument to a selfless man of great grace and remarkable achievements," Lonneke said. "Paul once told me that AIH stands for 'already in heaven.""

Contester and former ARRL staffer Dave Patton, NN1N, described Bittner as "such a good man and truly great ham." W1AW Station Manager Joe Carcia, NJ1Q, noted that Bittner had volunteered to operate as W1AW/9 as a headquarters station in the 2019 IARU HF Championship to celebrate his decades in ham radio.

NCJ Editor Scott Wright, KoMD, said that Bittner helped to build stations for many midwestern hams. "He was a mentor to hundreds of hams, and his enthusiasm for contesting was infectious," Wright said. Bittner had said he wanted to be buried with a bible, a telegraph key, and a climbing belt.

"Thank you for giving so much of yourself to me and the rest of the ham community," said contester Scott Neader. "We will never forget you."


