October 11 CARA Monthly Meeting Minutes de N1GSA



Meeting called to order at 8:00pm by Pres. Marcus Swearingen.

Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Paul Estefan and his wife were welcomed.

Round robin introductions were given with 12 people present.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and accepted.

Treasurer reported an opening balance of \$6742.40. Ending balance of \$6877.40

Gregory spoke on the Repeater. The power supply to the Link Controller needs to be reconnected. This is purely an oversight. The present link controller needs alignment. The required test equipment for this is being investigated. The handles on the doors to the container are in very sad condition. Paul Estefan spoke of his attempt to have a road built to access this container site. This was

turned down due to cost. The only other site that could be used would be on Moses Mountain. While this is accessible, it is not as large or has the electrical power to supply our needs.

The membership list has been gone over. There are 14 that are on the list that are being contacted to check on status.

Marcus had Paul Estefan come to the front of the room where he presented him with a plaque for his continued help and assistance in our events. This both encompasses our Field Day events as well as continued use of EOC equipment for our public service events. Paul spoke about the beginnings of our use of Spruce Mountain and how the container came to be placed there.

The vote to change the start time of the regular meeting could not take place due to a lack of quorum.

There needs to be a Special Election for the office of Secretary. Anyone with nominations should contact Harlan or Marcus.

JOTA was discussed. Ken has not responded with further details. Bud has sent notifications to the Boy Scout Troops in the area. No response has come from this either. The plan is that this event would be from 9am to 3pm. With no further information it was decided that we would not participate.

The CARA website update was brought up for discussion. Dan will contact the woman at the Brookfield Library to see if she would be willing to assist. Dan spoke about having a single person to be the coordinator for content. Jim Ritterbush is presently acting as webmaster on the site, but he is living in

VA. This is a very intensive job and he is doing this as a member of the club. The plan for a YCCC/CARA combined meeting would-be put-on hold until spring.

Bud, John A, and Dan have investigated possibilities for the Christmas Party. Armando's could accommodate us for \$30 each, tip included, on Thurs December 5th. We would need to guarantee 20 to reserve the venue. This information should be put on the reflector. This price is contingent on waiving the State Tax, prompting our need for the Tax Number.

Motion made to have the 2019 CARA Christmas Party at Armando's Restaurant with a guarantee of 20 people. The cost would be \$30.00 per attendee. This would be a Club sanctioned event. Motion seconded and passed. This price does not include dessert. This could come from BJ's or Costco and would commemorate our 50th anniversary. Motion made to spend \$50.00 on a dessert of cake and ice cream. This was seconded, discussed, and passed. Marcus will handle the ordering of the cake at BJ's.

Gregory spoke on the Warren Woods event with the NARA club. That does take place this weekend and all would be welcome to participate.

Harlan has been investigating the President's Plaque and it's need for updating. There is space for 5 more names. There are at least 7 more names that need to be added. Dan obtained a price of \$60 for a new plaque to be placed with the original to accommodate more names.

Paul mentioned the Danbury EOC as a possible place to display this. Motion made to purchase a plaque with a price not to exceed \$75, to add to the existing plaque.

This will include the addition of the names necessary to bring this current. This was seconded and passed.

Reminder that the Planning meeting is Oct. 25th.

The deadline for Capers input is November 1st.

Motion made to pay \$100 to the State of CT for our Tax Registration Number. Seconded and passed.

Motion to donate \$25 to the upcoming ALS walk in the name of Jay Albano. Seconded and passed.

Dan gave a presentation on the Boxboro convention. There was a tremendous amount of information about many aspects of Amateur Radio.

Meeting adjourned at 10pm.

Meeting called to order at 7:30 by Pres. Marcus Swearingen.

6 members present.

Roger will be giving the presentation in Nov. about Antenna Analyzers.

John had the Autumn issue of QST that he mentioned had suggestions about programs for upcoming meetings.

Charlie brought up about changing the PO box which has its renewal in January. We should update the listed officers to allow access. He also mentioned about changing locations to make it a more central location and increase accessibility. We should also get another key to open the box. At present we only have one key that Bill Webb oversees. Charlie will take care of this.

Charlie has received the Tax Registration Number. We also need to document our charitable donations to conform to our status. This could be a donation to the Fire House, the ALS walk, etc.

John spoke to Mike Walters about the Microsoft program that gives multiple email accounts as well as a .org designation for our club use. This would entail going thru a Microsoft Partner which does have a small cost. This would come with Microsoft Office Suite, passwords, updates, etc. We could in the future have small meetings using a Skype type program. This would have minimal cost to the club. Mike would be willing to come down and explain this further and answer questions about this program.

Charlie has \$100 that was a donation for the repeater upgrade. This was started by Jay and has been in the Paypal pool account, earmarked for the repeater.

John mentioned that we need to make a trip to the Mountain to bring down the Motorola machine and place it back in the NF FD. This would allow 24hr accessibility to turn it on or off in times of need. He has found more Yaesu radios like ours, that are available for \$600. This could be used on the hill to link with the NARA system. All these radios are supplied with battery backup. This site is a priority electrical site due to the Airport equipment that is also at this site.

Charlie said that there have been some dues payments from members in arrears.



Great rig, but there was HV at the key; ouch!

The device to the left of the AT-1, was a "crystal switcher". I put my FT-243 XTALS into the sockets, then had one cord to the rig. It was homebrewed from a magazine article.

I worked WA3HUT/1 on Nov 19, 1968. 3.690 MHz. CW at 22:57 UTC.



This Time I used my Knight-Kit model T-150 transmitter at 150 watts! 3.69 MHz with the built- in VFO!

Carolina, as Captain of team Jay's Birds, raised nearly \$1,400 in donations in memory of her dad, Jay. CARA member's Marlon-KC1EHW, David-KB1ZAC, and Charlie-KC1IBR participated in the event to honor Jay and support the cause. "She was a great Captain and was so kind and warm-welcoming to her team members, providing blue ribbons and cheerful leadership!" Charlie KC1IBR commented.

Marlon KC1EHW, (close treasured friend to Jay) and his family further filled out the team. It was such a nice occasion to see Marlon who, by the way, had HT in hand the entire event!

CARA ARRL Charter Affiliation 50 Year Plaque – Presented to CARA in 1996



2019 marks 73 years of CARA's ARRL Charter of Affiliation on August 21, 1946.

Signed by: David Sumner - K1ZZ, ARRL Secretary, who would later become ARRL CEO. Now: Secretary, IARU - International Amateur Radio Union; Retired ARRL CEO.



DESCRIPTION

The AA-55 Zoom analyzer is designed for measuring SWR (Standing Wave Ratio), Return Loss, Cable Loss, of cable and antenna systems from 60 kHz to 55 MHz.

A built-in ZOOM capability makes graphical measurements especially effective.

The following tasks are easily accomplished by using this analyzer:

- Rapid check-out of an antenna
- Tuning an antenna to resonance
- Comparing characteristics of an antenna before and after specific event (rain, hurricane, etc.)
- Making coaxial stubs or measuring their parameters
- Cable fault location
- Measuring capacitance or inductance of reactive loads

AA-55 ZOOM differs from previous models in that it has:

- Enlarged 3.2 inch color TFT display (320×240).
- · Scanning speed has increased over AA-54.
- · Large waterproof keypad keys.
- Same dimensions as our AA-30/54/170.
