November 11 Monthly Meeting Minutes de Stephanie Fuda

Meeting called to order at 7:40pm by VP John Morelli.

Pledge of Allegiance was recited, and a moment of silence was observed.

There were 10 people present at Stony Hill FD.

Minutes of the previous meeting were accepted as printed in the CAPERS

Motion made by John A. and second by Charlie S.

New member Chris C. was introduced and a group introduction followed.

Treasurer reported Final Hamfest financial net was \$ 3289.99. One last reimbursement from ARRL for the VE session was expected in the post. John A. makes a motion to buy another \$ 1500 ibond seconded by Harlan and accepted by the group.

John A makes a motion that John or John be authorized to lock in the reservation at the PAL

building for 9/10/23 making the assumption the fee doesn't change. Motion was accepted.

Repeater report: Work on the repeater was carried out by Gregory G., Paulo S. and John M. with the following details:

Install Link antenna hardware, Modify Link control connector for Radio port, Prep / Repair 10-32 rack threads, Install Radio & Link gear, Cable connect Link antenna & polyphasers, reconnect duplexer / antenna, Test Link Control & repeaters, Site tidy up as manpower is available, Seal roof rRust spots with epoxy.

Membership:

John M. mentioned there was a prospect of two new members but didn't have details to share at the time.

Budget and Dues review:

John A, gave the following proposed budget and recommended dues structure per the requirements of the review board deliverables: Base budget for 2023

- Field day \$250 for supplies and does not include food, food will be selffunding
- Winter Field Day \$250 for supplies and does not include food, food will be selffunding
- Repeater -\$500 for ongoing repairs and maintenance
- Administration \$1200 Insurances, post office, printing, donations Total \$2200

Members: 60

Approximate number of current full members

Proposed Dues: \$35

Associate non-voting membership: \$15

Eliminate and delete section of policy relating to the 50% senior discount.

Discussion regarding the changes focused on three main points:

- How to communicate the changes and recognition status.
- The removal of the senior discount for membership.
- Are the annual budgets going to be the driver for dues fees going forward

Voting by email was the proposed method to get these changes in front of as many voting members as possible, with a preliminary email going out to advise members of the upcoming vote and then seven days in which the vote could Old Business be cast.

This was the procedure added to the bylaws as an emergency amendment during the Covid pandemic and never rescinded and was felt to be HAM-Fest fair.

Also, those present wanted to make sure that those who were not able to physically attend had an opportunity to participate.

John M. then suggested a special email account dedicated for the collection of the votes.

The removal of the discounted membership for seniors saw opposition by some members present as a deterrent to the retention of some of the membership, and it was recognized that we may lose some members based on this change.

John A. did state that the proposed budget did take into account this attrition.

The last question was if the annual budget would drive the dues fees going forward, to which the answer is "yes."

While we strive to keep the dues as low as possible, in order to run the club in a healthy way effectively to the voting body, it's fairness that provides the same high-value engagement, the dues fees must reflect the cost of operation.

There were 10 people present. This was a TEAMS only meeting, in place of the regular planning meeting due to the Thanksgiving holiday.

There was discussion about the email voting.

Electronic meetings and voting were included in the Policies and Procedures as of the last amendment. There was some confusion regarding the terminology of temporary status. As this was originally proposed to cover the problems arising from COVID. This has never been removed, neither was it given a timeline or ending date.

Its mission is to foster the use of CW, whether for contesting, DX'ing, traffic handling, or engaging in conversations.

CARA members, Dan Fegley – W1QK (CWOps Lifetime Member #1506) and Roger Mitchell – NG1R (Cwops Lifetime Member #2087) are attempting to make arrangements with the CWOps CW Academy Administration so they can conduct a CW training class based on the CWops Beginner training curriculum. This proposed class may start in January.

For the beginner

- 1. Want to communicate with fellow hams around the world using even a modest rig and antenna?
- 2. Want to stay in touch when on vacation to some remote area where you don't have access to a repeater or cell phone service?
- 3. Want to meet a whole new community of amateurs that share a common bond?
- 4. Want to expand your operating capabilities with little or no cost?

If you answered "Yes" to any of the questions, then becoming skilled in CW is the answer. CW Academy is the means for you to learn a new skill that will open a world of fun and opportunity.

For those that want something new but are not confident to take the plunge

- 1. I love chasing DX and I want to try something new.
- 2. I like contesting and would like to be better at CW radiosport.
- 3. I've tried CW learning aids, but nothing seems to work for me.
- 4. CW intrigues me but I'm worried about the challenge.

If this sounds like you, then this special CWops CW Academy is absolutely right for you and is available to CARA members.

There is no cost or obligation to participate in this special CWops CW Academy class and membership is not required. Enrollment will be open to anyone in CARA with the desire to learn Morse Code. CWops and CW Academy training and mentoring for Beginners and those with Morse Code experience needing is offered three times a year, in two-month increments: Jan-Feb; May-Jun; Sep-Oct by the CWOps CW Academy. There's usually a waiting list for the publicly-offered classes.

CW Academy is a program put on by the CW Operators' Club aimed at increasing the number of competent CW operators on the HF CW sub-bands. It addresses all levels of enthusiasts: from those aspiring to become licensed operators who want to learn and use Dedication to 60 minutes of daily practice Morse code; to veteran operators who are intent on increasing their CW skills, speed and activity.

CW Academy semester description:

Eight-weeks long and held three times per year (Jan-Feb, May-Jun and Sep-Oct).

The proposed CARA Cwops course may be conducted with twice-weekly sessions on Tuesday's and Thursday's each week starting at 7:30 PM and will run for an hour.

CARA's students will be given daily assignments prior to each meeting, and the twice weekly meetings will be held online using the TEAMS platform.

During these online meetings, students and advisors can all see and hear each other, as well as the Morse being sent by any of them. Using TEAMS creates, in effect, a virtual training room.

CARA CW Beginner Class Participant requirements:

Minimum essentials:

High speed broadband internet access Access to Windows operating system or capable emulation

Computing device (desktop, laptop)

Webcam (camera, microphone) either built-in or USB add-on

Key paddle (single lever or dual lever) Keyer with sidetone or radio with built-in keyer and sidetone

Dan and Roger have requested that those who participate and demonstrate acceptable performance will receive a standard CWops Certificate of Completion and be eligible to continue their study as a CWOps CW Academy Student.

There are now four levels of CWops CW Academy courses:

Beginner – Limited or no prior experience with Morse Code

Class Objectives:

Learn Morse Code characters (letters, numbers, and some punctuation) Learn to head copy and send Morse Code Learn on-air protocols of a basic QSO Use skills for on-air basic QSOs Learn Morse Code to 6 wpm plus

The proposed local CARA class will attempt to follow the curriculum and schedule of the CWOps **Beginner** class that's publicly conducted.

After obtaining approval from the CWops CW between sessions to ensure progression. Academy Administrator, we will announce the registration procedure.

CARA members in good standing (paid dues) practice and review to achieve success. will be given first opportunity to register for this 6 - week class, which will be conducted twice per week via MS Teams.

Enrollment in the CARA CWops Beginner class will be on a First Come - First Served basis with a maximum class size of 10 students based on the time and date of application.

NARA members in good standing, then CT ARES Region 5 members will have second and third options if seats are available.

No straight keys will be used for this class, since the purpose is to emphasize learning the code by pattern recognition while the elements of letters, numbers and punctuation are electronically created precisely and repeatably.

"HAM" - A UNIVERSITY OF MONTANA DOCUMENTARY

NOVEMBER 29, 2022 KOSTK COMMENT ABOUT THIS POST This 25 minute documentary begins in 1983 with NASA Astronaut Owen K. Garriott W5LFL (SK) calling CQ with an HT over the US West Coast from the Space Shuttle Columbia, a brief pile-up, and his first contact from orbit: WA1IXM from Montana.

The story *fast forwards* to 2022 where we meet

four Montana Hams—Lance WA1JXM,

Mike <u>K7MSO</u>, Dennis <u>KR7Q</u>, and Keith <u>NE7R</u>—and learn about their backgrounds and how

they are involved in the hobby.

Featuring stunning Montana landscapes and tasteful shack and rig photography, the documentary includes discussions of 6M Moonbounce, POTA, DXpeditions (including footage from Clipperton Island), and FT8, along with many well chosen images. And archival footage of salient quotes from Vic Clark W4KFC, former ARRL President, and a young David Sumner K1ZZ, former ARRL CEO.

There's even the obligatory commentary on CW vs phone operators.

The documentary concludes with a very accurate summarization of Ham Radio from WA1JMX, "[it is] a wonderful way to bring the world together."

Viewers who watch to the end of the closing credits will see that the film makers did understand their subject matter.




The CT ARES Region 5 Simulated



Conversely, a station using minimal equipment and/or compromised antennas is called a "Little Pistol".



Nice QRQ practice app: Ditto CW player

For anyone out there wants to practice any aspects of their CW copying, Ditto CW Player is a free app that I can recommend.

I have no connection with the app or the developer so not trying to sell it (it is free anyway).

Morse Code Ninja, has a website and YouTube presence and has a giant number of practice files even one for the CWT exchange! But when I do my CW practice on the train, I didn't find it convenient to use (internet connection).

Billy WB1LLY created what amounts to an app version of Morse Code Ninja (which I think is fully open source) that is very convenient to use when out and about.

There is no internet connection needed to use the app. Another plus is that Morse Code Ninja materials are limited to 50 wpm, but this app is not.

I can't hold a conversational QSO at 50 wpm (!) but I am exploring my "one word" limits and copy at 90% or higher accuracy at that speed, so it's no longer helpful to practice there.

Fortunately it seems that Ditto can go as high as you want and you can put in any speed (like 200 wpm!) and it will do it.

Support is excellent. The app was initially slightly chopping off the first part of the first character (on my phone at least), and I mentioned it to Billy. This amounted to losing the first dit at 50 wpm. Within 24 hours he added a slight delay at the start and now it sounds perfect to me!

Anyway, I found this very exciting so thought to pass it Bruce every December by giving a nice donation. on.



CARA POTA Guidelines

Purpose: To set forth operating guidelines for CARA sanctioned POTA events.

- Those members who plan on bringing their stations shall sign up so the POTA coordinator can set up the operating schedule
- Those members who plan on participating w/o equipment will sign up as an operator
- Multiple stations will coordinate operating conditions and band plan
 - o Each station will use the CARA filters for the band assigned
 - o Each station shall determine their respective operating mode
 - Stations shall change operating bands each hour, example:
 - First hour of operation: station 1 on 40m; station 2 on 20m; station 3 on 15m; etc.
 - Second hour of operation: station 1 on 15m; station 2 on 40m; station 3 on 20m; etc.
 - Third hour of operation: station 1 on 20m; station 2 on 15m; station 3 on 40m; etc.
 - Repeat
- Use this activation as a means for new or inexperienced hams to get on the air!
