

Committee Reports:

Repeater: Steve, W1SMS updated those present on the status of the repeater location discussions with the City of Danbury; nothing concrete at this time, city planning on moving their equipment off site within a year. The 2m and 440 repeaters remain stable. Steve classified the status of the 220 and 6m repeaters as a science experiment. The 220 equipment will be set up and tested at his 9th. The 6m equipment is on the "hill" and needs to be retrieved since it is not functioning. Steve also mentioned his recent visit to a potential repeater site in Danbury. This site could allow repeaters and antennas on its roof. This location would give good coverage to the east given its location on the west side of Danbury. More to follow as this opportunity develops.

Website/Reflector Committee: Stephanie proposed we move our website to the "Go of approximately \$20 per month. After discussion a motion was made to move our website to GoDaddy. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously. The discussions continued about the reflector. A motion was made and seconded to move our reflector to IO Groups. The motion was approved unanimously. Stephanie and John, W1JMA will begin the migration process. It was decided to continue to pay the Host Gator fee of \$150 for another year till the migration process is completed.

Operating Activities: The following activities were discussed:

- 1. Winter FD January 27/28. John, W1JGM will seek approval from Ball Pond FD for use of the facility. Dave, WA1JGA reminded members that they should purchase the recommended KOSS headset. W1JMA will again circulate that information.
- Putnam Park 10-2

- 3. Our first Club Station on the Air is scheduled for Saturday 12/9 12:30 to 3pm at the W1JMA Station. Sign up Guiness will be sent to solicit participants.
- 4. Other activities discussed on the horizon:
 - a. Ham Radio University in Long Island in January
 - **b.** Field trip to the radio museum in Windsor in February
 - c. Other programs of interest in the spring

Membership Committee: There were no new members in October.

Hamfest/Fundraising: John, W1JGM, discussed the amount of work needed to successfully run a hamfest. While this year's event made Daddy" hosting and maintenance option at a cost approximately \$2300, the effort was great in both the planning and day of event. Discussions were had on other fundraising methods that might be employed. It was noted that the attendance was only 170 this year compared to 300+ in years prior to COVID.

Old Business:

Dan – W1QK, reported that CARA's 40m Half-Square has been repaired and ready for use in WFD.

Bud reminded the group that the sign up for the Holiday Party at the Vespucci club has been circulated. The dinner is on Thursday 12/28 at 7:00 pm. The cost is \$33 per person.

Steve updated the group on the status of the "maker space" opportunity. There is definite interest from the Maker Space administration to have a ham radio presence once the facility gets 2. The next POTA is Saturday 11/18/23 at zoning approval. More to follow as this develops.

Bud suggested that a public information officer be appointed to promote ham radio in the various media outlets. Anyone interested in volunteering should contact Bud.

New CARA badges will be made available in 2024 after the dues collection period has been completed.

Jim related how the analysis of a ferrite toroid core choke balun is confirmed with an actual measurement of attenuation. He also explained how the "L" network and impedance transformer are used to interface to an end-fed half wave vertical for 20 meters with analysis for 50 Ohms without residual reactance.





A brief Q&A session was held during Jim's presentation.



OVERVIEW OF THE PROGRAM: -----

Purpose: Experienced club members host a twohour block of time for other club members to tour and operate from their shack using the W1QI

Procedure:



W1QH appointed as new ARES Region 5 CT DEC

Harlan Ford – W1QH, has recently been appointed by CT Section Manager, Bud Kozloff – W1NSK, to the position of CT ARES Region 5 District Emergency Coordinator – DEC.

Harlan has served as CT ARES Region 5 ADEC, Assistant District Coordinator, for many years and brings his experience and knowledge of DEC responsibilities to his new appointment.

He has been working at KX1EOC, the Danbury EOC station to confirm station equipment operation and preparation for drills and any activation. Charlie has been assisted by Dan AC1 a new ham who resides in Danbury during the ARES nets and checking into the Sunday CARA net from KX1EOC, located at the Danbury City Hall.

CT National Guard Communications Drill - November 16

On November 16, members of the Connecticut National Guard met in New Fairfield for the purpose of testing their Interactive Communications Systems. The system is designed to provide interoperability between the municipal Emergency Management Directors (EMD), first responders, the Connecticut State Division of Homeland Security Agency, and the Connecticut National Guard Civil Support.

The purpose was to coordinate operations – plus provide real-time high-speed satellite Internet service and First Net cellular coverage.



The National Guard determined that several Steven McCarthy – KC1EEQ, has been appointed towns on Connecticut's western border with New York presented challenging communication issues with other parts of the state.

> A pre-planning meeting was conducted a week prior to the drill at the New Fairfield Emergency Operations Center – EOC, to discuss the event and choose two sites to conduct the drill. Several sites were considered. The Macedonia Brook State Park in Kent, and the Great Hollow Nature Preserve in New Fairfield were selected for the drill.

The intent was to communicate with each other along with CT National Guard headquarters in Hartford.



Those participating in the drill included the New Fairfield Emergency Operations Director (EMD), the New Fairfield town Fire Marshall, and John Morelli – W1JGM, who represented the New Fairfield Fire Department. Harlan Ford – W1QH, newly appointed CT ARES Region 5 District Emergency Coordinator, was an invited guest observer from ARES and CARA.

Approximately 15 members of the National Guard participated in the exercise.



Several Connecticut National Guard vehicles arrived at the New Fairfield site around 9:00 am to set up VHF, UHF, and satellite communications. The equipment was fully self-contained, and included a generator, backup batteries, and a 50-foot telescopic mast to support UHF and VHF antennas.

A portable satellite dish with its associated radio equipment was deployed.



After becoming familiar with the UHF and VHF equipment, the National Guard operators in New Fairfield established reliable contact with other operators at the Kent site and Hartford Headquarters. Several attempts to make satellite contact were unsuccessful. It wasn't apparent if the difficulty was equipment or site related, because access with the satellite couldn't be established.





This National Guard training exercise demonstrated why it's important to continuously train with the equipment used - whether that equipment is commercial, military, or amateur. It's critically important to know the characteristics, performance capabilities and limitations of the systems that are used.

A follow-up drill will be scheduled in the spring.

Harlan and John explained about amateur radio's ARRL Field Day, POTA, and other special event operations to the Guard's participants. They were interested to learn what hams do during portable field operations. Harlan and John also advised them about CARA.




