Sermon: II Peter 1:6-9

Christians in Yemen usually keep their faith secret, because if they are discovered then they could face the death penalty. Leaving Islam is forbidden, and all Yemenis are considered Muslims by the state.

It's not just the authorities who persecute Christians. Islamic militant groups threaten Christians from a Muslim background with death, and tribes may kill or banish anybody converting to Christianity.

The ongoing war, humanitarian crisis and COVID-19 pandemic in Yemen are impacting all citizens, but Christians are additionally vulnerable because emergency relief is mostly distributed through organizations that use local Islamic leaders and local mosques to give aid. These are believed to discriminate against anybody who is not considered to be a devout Muslim. There are accounts of Yemeni Christians being refused treatment at under-resourced hospitals.

The consequence of having and continuing in these virtues is that we are reaping/we will reap a spiritual harvest. We will be productive in the kingdom. Peter states it negatively: Not being diligent, being inactive will produce ineffectiveness and, sadly, we will be ______ in society.

Is it any wonder that human beings are idle or unfruitful, though claiming Christ as Lord, lack assurance?

IV. No Effort, No Pursuit, No Fruit =

A person who has a true knowledge of Jesus but lacks these virtues is blind, short-sighted, unable to discern his own spiritual condition. This person should lack assurance but they've convinced themselves of their security.

- If you're a believer, God has given you everything needed for life and godliness.
- Maybe today you're lacking assurance of your salvation. Examine yourself for these virtues.
- If you lack them, begin today adding/supplementing
