Forgiveness 5 II Corinthians 2:5-11

Last and this week we cover the benefits of forgiveness. This Scripture passage regards Paul teaching the church at Corinth that it needs to forgive the man who was rebellious towards Paul and restore him to fellowship. Last week we looked at Forgiveness Deflects Pride, Forgiveness Shows Mercy and Forgiveness Restores Joy. We finish the 7 Benefits this Sunday.

IV. Forgiveness Affirms Love.

The church had publicly noted the man's rebellion		
and began treating him as a tax collector. Paul now		
calls on them to publicly announce/show their		
for him. It's the real test of love: how		
we forgive when offended. "Almost		
nothing can fracture a church where		
is, because unresolved issues are		
never left to" (MacArthur).		

V. Forgiveness Proves Obedience

The church had been obedient in removing the man from the church due to his unrepentant behavior. Now that he had repented, they needed to be obedient in restoring him.

Some things are easier to do for sure, like singing, praying, reading Scripture. Affirming someone after their sin and repentance can be difficult but necessary.

VI. Forgiveness Revitalizes Fellowship

In this thought Paul was re-emphasizing that		
bitterness and vengeance had no place in a church		
was vital. Paul wanted to make sure		
the entire church understood that he had forgiven		
this man.		

VII. Forgiveness Thwarts Satan

benefits we've been covering. In a person,		
unforgiveness destroys that individual. It also will		
destroy a church as well. Having an unforgiving spirit		
provides a ground for him and a
