In his younger years, he incorporated his love for the Earth traveling the states with his pickup truck and bed camper. After time spent traveling he returned to Interlaken to continue his passion for dairy farming. Karl was proud of the 50 head dairy farm that he owned and operated from 1970 to 1996 on Munson Road.

After selling the farm, he continued to raise beef animals for almost 20 years. He enjoyed his time in the barns and field, as well as his time being a father, husband, and Papa. He always looked forward to spending time with his family and enjoyed get togethers with everyone around.

You couldn't ask for a nicer person. Karl was always willing to lend a helping hand or piece of equipment to anyone who needed it. He always saw the good in things and the best in people and never had a bad thing to say about anyone.

Karl was never in a big rush unless the rain was going to fall on hay that needed to be covered or when silos needed filling before sunset. It was the simple things that made his heart happy, things that went along with life on the farm. The smell of fresh cut hay, freshly plowed soil, his dog running alongside his tractor, newly born calves, a full silo, corn crib, and haymow. These are just a few things that made his heart content on the farm. He would often say "Did you hear the birds talking?" or "Did you hear the wind today? It's beautiful!"

It is our hope that with this year's plow days that you take a minute to enjoy the smell of the new ground that is turned over, and that it makes your heart as happy as it did our Dad.

## Wells Barn Legacy Project

With no formal training as an architect, John Talcott Wells, Sr., a native of Wheatland, New York, patented an innovative arched truss system in 1889. The ultimate problem-solver, Wells constructed soaring, cathedral-like barns with open, uncluttered interior spaces. Freed of the obstacles previously presented by post and beam construction, farmers could roll their hay wagons directly inside a Wells Barn, drastically improving their efficiency.

Between 1886-1942, The Wells Family constructed over 100 barns, spread mostly throughout Western New York. Today, fewer than fifty Wells Barns are still standing – serving as "sentinels of the past" and silent testaments to the ingenuity and craftsmanship of John Talcott Wells, Sr. and his sons.



The Wells Barn Legacy Project's goals are to bring about greater awareness to the history and architecture of J.T. Wells and Sons and the need to document and preserve the remaining barns.

Barb Chapman will provide historical background and biographical information about the amazingly talented J. T. Wells.



Katie Andres will use vintage photographs and original Wells drawings to describe in detail the structure of the barns and the construction process.



Dick Thomas will use his beautiful barn photographs to illustrate the importance of Wells Barns in our agricultural heritage and rural landscapes.
