When not flying, Dan has enjoyed applying his maintenance skills to manage aircraft inspections and major projects in Cameroon. His current project is coordinating an aircraft replacement project for Cameroon.

Rachael adds many talents to the team in Cameroon where she has served as the safety manager and has implemented a new computerized inventory and work order management system while working through her flight check out. She is a certified flight instructor and is currently pursuing her CFII.

The Stoners are currently on home assignment and plan on returning to Cameroon in January of 2020.
