SOURCES OF INSPIRATION AND ARTWORK

It all started when I was 9 years old and a client of my mother Delia, who was a painter, invited me to visit the Almendares River in Havana to develop my artistic abilities painting and drawing small fishing boats.

My father Fermín, who was a self-taught artist inspired me to keep experimenting with different techniques that included painting and the use of materials such as wood and found objects without the need of buying them.

Later, as a young man, and after three years of studies at the School of Medicine at the University of Havana, I decided to expand my studies in the visual arts, this time at the Art Institute of Pittsburgh. Later, as an adult and many experiences with different stages and levels in the study of the visual arts, applied graphic design and illustration, I found that the construction of pieces of art with mixed materials helped me develop work in the discipline of sculpture. Experimentation and the study of different media facilitated multiple possibilities to express and build works of art through monolithic or modular installations and computer technologies.

Parallel with the study of multi media in art production, the history of art has complemented my development as an artist, specially the history of the arts in Mesoamerica, Native North America, Africa, the Caribbean and Europe. European art movements such as Impressionism, Post-Impressionism, Expressionism, Art Deco and Art Nouveau served to expand my understanding of the evolution of contemporary art. From Cuba the work of Amelia Peláez, René Portocarrero, Servando Cabrera, Rita Longa and Alfredo Sosabravo and Puerto Rican ceramicist Jaime Suarez have inspired my work.

I am happy that my forced separation from Cuba was for only thirteen years (1966-1979). After those years I had the opportunity of returning many times to my homeland Cuba. This new experience with family, friends and fellow artists opened a new space to continue with my artistic and educational activities. These encounters generated new spiritual energies that, together with the support of my Puerto Rican friend Dr. Pedro O. Schuck, allow for collaborative projects in the arts and education bringing together the great histories of Cuba and Puerto Rico.


At the same time, I have to acknowledge the contribution to my development by institutions such as: Art Institute of Pittsburgh, Carnegie Museum of Art, Museum School of Fine Arts of Boston, Montserrat College of Art, Cambridge College, Candina Ceramic Workshop, Jájome Art School, the University of Puerto Rico and PuertoRicoCubArtEdu. I also have to thank my father Fermin Carvajal and mother Delia Barrios for their unconditional support in my development as an artist and my re encounter with my homeland Cuba.

Projects such as the creation of educational programs in the arts and culture in Cuba and Puerto Rico have contributed to see us as who we are, people in the process of development where creativity through the arts makes us worthy of our identity and values.

My intention is to communicate in a simple way my journey through life, including turning points moments, inspirations and feelings since I was a child and now after sixty-six years in the arts. My goal is for others to be inspired and motivated so together we create what we are capable of building when our hearts and intelligences are in harmony. The Cuban Apostle José Martí said that art is a form of harmony.
