# Environmental Awareness and Access to Green Space

The lack of greenspace and environmental awareness is a devasting combination for ELA residents. The launching of CRC's Playgrounds and Pollinators Project within LAUSD schools will begin our initiative to allow youth to have access to Green Space and a future in Green Jobs and the sciences.

Our Collective has a parallel objective to tilt the perspective of how philanthropy and gatekeepers engage people of color and how leaders of color gain access, respect, and equal footing with philanthropic entities in order to better serve their communities. Therefore, we are seeking partners that understand the discrepancies in how funding bypasses communities and are willing to provide funds that not only support programs but will challenge how and to whom funds are distributed.

## **Needed resources:**

- \$5,000 in seed funding for website and technology
- \$5,000 for program, curriculum and organizational development
- \$10,000 to jumpstart our life skill training in schools.
- \$10,000 to jumpstart our environmental awareness programs in schools.
