

## Mystery Quilt Part Four

### Assembling the Quilt:

Assemble the following 6 different units of 4. Sew the number shown for each.

Fabric A is shown here in Blue and Fabric B is shown as Black Tweed, and Fabric C is White.

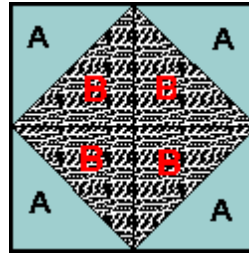
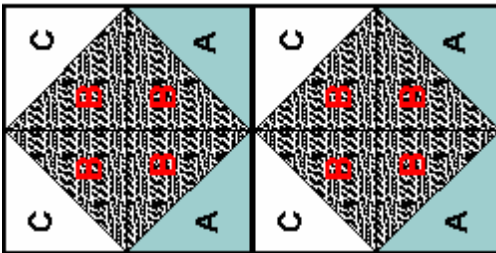
For the easiest assembly, first sew the 2 top pairs of squares for each unit, then the bottom pairs. Then, match the center seam (either nest or press open so that they lay nicely) and sew at the center to make your 4-patch.

If you used different fabrics for A, B, and/or C – assemble them randomly into these units.

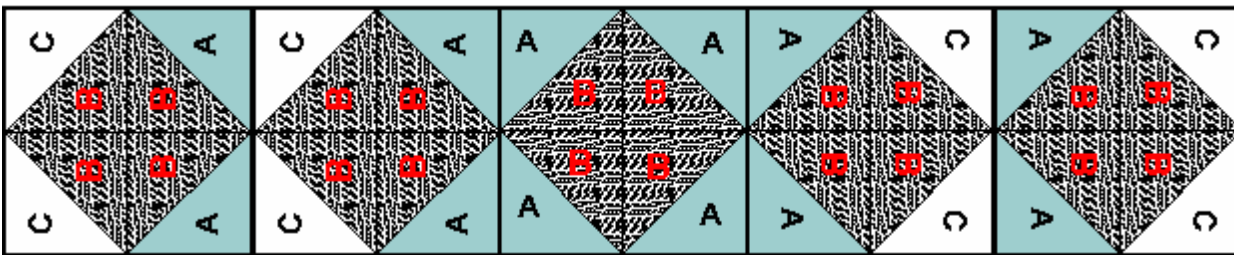
### Step 1:

Using the 2 of the units from part 3, and

Unit 5 (you only made 1 of these)

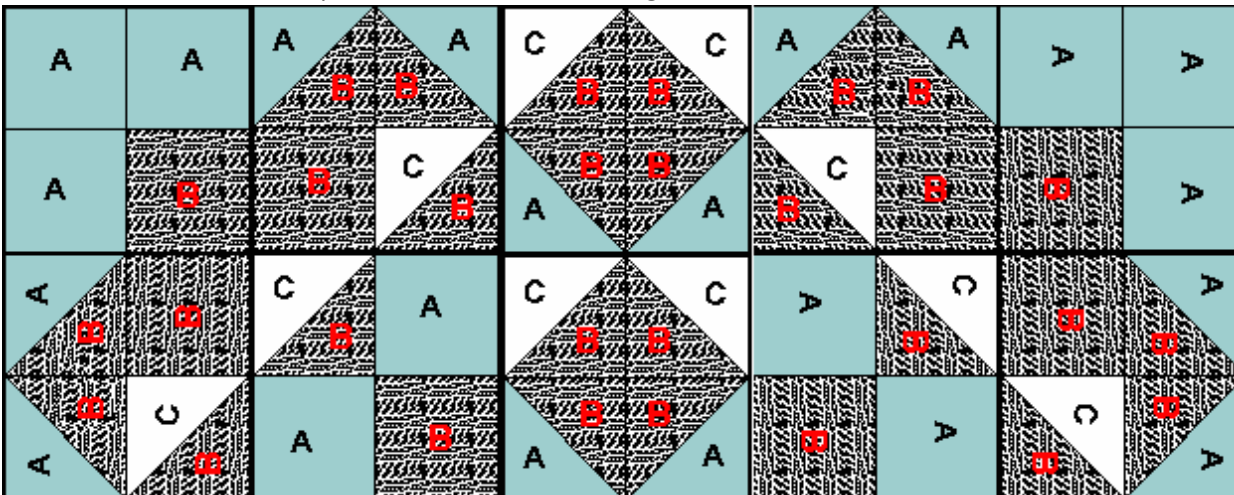


Assemble as here:



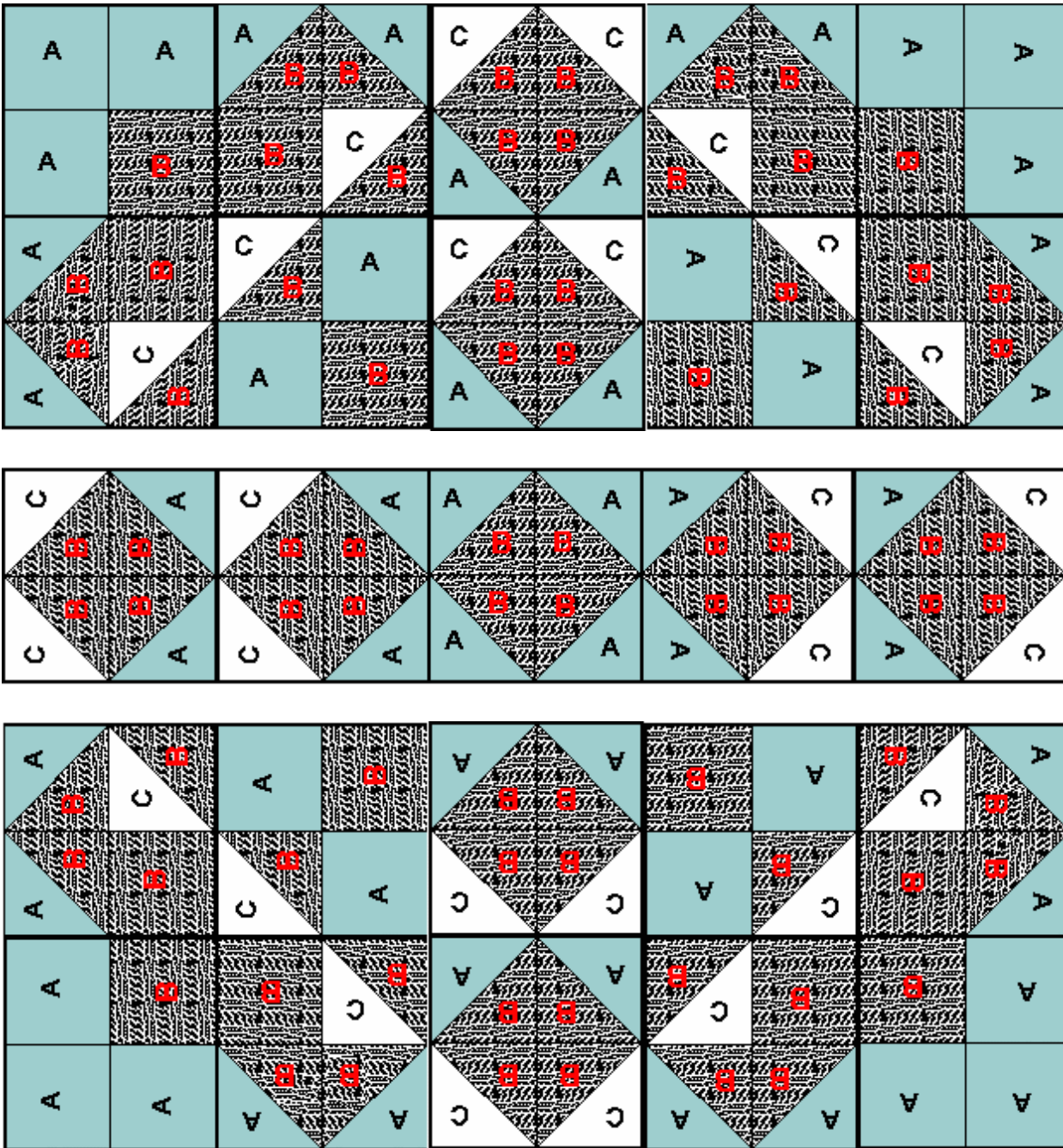
### Step 2:

Now assemble 2 of the 16-patch units with a remaining unit from above as here. Make 2



**Step 3:**

Place the strip from Step 1 between the 2 units you just made as shown here:



**Step 4 (Optional):**

Remember all the extra squares you cut in part 1? You can now use them to make a prairie point border. However, that is optional and you can choose to ignore this step.

Border your quilt as YOU desire.
