As purebred dog enthusiasts we approach each breeding with the hope that something special will result - and with particular dogs those hopes are that much higher. Such was the case when Donna contacted us about breeding the lovely Apolina to Carlo, our English import. While Carlo has been a strong producer of quality, we encouraged Donna to consider Carlo's son Caribe, as he is higher on leg, has Busy as his dam, and the overall combination made more sense to us. Donna did just that and June 6, 2011 the Apolina x Caribe kids were born, including a standout black curly male ultimately named Matisse.

Since that time it has been a whirlwind for Matisse, completing his Canadian championship at age six months and his American championship at eight months, all owner handled and with multiple group placements



along the way. Under Donna's watchful eye Matisse was developing as hoped, and our intent was to have our long-time handler Michael Scott further assess this youngster at the 2012 PWDCA National Specialty. The goal was to better understand whether Matisse had what it takes to be a special.

It was a pleasure seeing Donna handle Matisse to Best in Sweepstakes under noted PWD authority Jack Girton, proving that the pup could be recognized at both all-breed and specialty shows. That said, by the time Jack gave Matisse the nod for Best, Michael had already identified this boy as having the potential to be not just a good special, but a great special. Sensing Michael's enthusiasm, we knew there was no way that he was heading

back to his home in Maryland without that 15 month old PWD!

Michael and Matisse practiced throughout the remainder of 2012, winning several groups and their first Best in early December. After a holiday rest, team Matisse entered 2013 by storm. As of this writing and having just celebrated his second birthday, Matisse has garnered 45 Bests in Show, 14 Reserve Bests in Show, and 72 Group Firsts, including the very thrilling Group win at the Garden. This has propelled Matisse to Number Two Dog All Breeds, Number One Working Dog, Number One PWD and the top winning PWD of all time.



Such is the curse of this addiction to the sport of dogs, where just occasionally those "special" breedings not only meet, but exceed your wildest expectations.

AKC - Canine Good Citizen

The Club hosted an AKC Canine Good Citizen Clinic & Test – open to all breeds March 15th at the Scottsdale Stonegate Equestrian Park. A great time was had by all and all the dogs participating were "Good Citizens"! We had a Lab, Bernese Mountain Dog and King Charles Cavalier, as well as PWDs of ALL ages! The CGC is designed to reward dogs with good manners in their home and community. It is a 10 step test which includes sit & down. This is a great test and many dogs pass with practice.

The clinic, taught by Stacy Larsen, was an overview of the test and an opportunity to practice prior to taking the

test. The testing followed the clinic session.

Stacy was also our judge for the testing - what a fantastic judge she was too! The dogs loved her and if one had a problem with one of the testing items, Stacy was able to help the dog and owner through it - not always to a successful title, but definitely a successful end.



What is the Rio Salgado Portuguese Water Dog Club?

Dogs: brown, black, black and white, brown and white, puppies, adults, retriever clip, lion clip, show/conformation dogs, working dogs, couch potatoes, zoomies. **People**: professionals, students, retired, military, young, old. Our club is made up of an extremely diversified group of dogs and people, living across a huge area. What do we have in common – the love of our dogs and the dogs love of their masters. Our club was formed to socialize, to help others, to promote our dogs and to play with our dogs.

Rio Salgado? Portuguese for **SALT RIVER** which is the largest tributary of the Gila River. The river is about 200 miles long. Its drainage basin is about 13,700 square miles large. The longest of the Salt River's many tributaries is the 195-mile Verde River. The Salt's headwaters tributaries, the Black River and East Fork, increase the river's total length to about 300 miles. So, just as our club members come from all over the state (and out of state), so do the waters that make up the Rio Salgado. Canyon Lake is formed from the Salt River!

What do we do? We try to have activities at least every other month. We have two BIG yearly events: the Supported Entry at the Fiesta Cluster dog show and the Last Chance Water Trial. What is a Supported Entry? A supported entry is when a breed club sponsors any part of the entry at the show, by providing the prizes, ribbons or trophies for that breed. Usually there will be a larger than normal entry of that particular breed. The club supplies prizes for qualifying PWDs in performance classes. We also have our annual formal dinner at this time – in an effort to bring all PWD fanciers together that are showing at the show and raise money for the club through auctions and raffles. This is our biggest money maker. And our Water Trial – The Last Chance Water Trial – is held in the fall. This too brings in fellow PWDs from around the country. The Water Trial Committee puts a LOT of effort into making this a great experience and where better to do it than the beautiful blue lake of Canyon Lake Marina. We don't make much money at this event—revenues are high, but the net income is minimal. But these are just two of our annual events. We also have fun events, educational events and social events – oh, we have club meetings too! Check the last page of the newsletter for our complete calendar!

How does the club determine what to charge club members for and why do we want to make money if we're non-profit? Non-profit doesn't mean that we can't make money, it simply means that any surplus revenues must be used for self-preservation, expansion or plans. Money we make goes back into the club. It cost money to pay for fun events and parties, but also to pay for Liability Insurance and articles for training (boats, equipment, ring set-ups,etc) as well as judges for our events. We try to run by this rule:

No charge – all Fun only events (walk in the park, parties, etc)

Minimal Fee - Functions that lead to a title for your dog (yes, even grooming!, water workshops, therapy dogs) and Titling Events themselves (conformation, water trials, agility, tracking, etc).

Club members do get a discount over non-club members, minimal, but still it's a benefit!

So we make money and have a good time. **What do we do with the surplus money?** The club donates to various organizations: National Club Specialty, Regional Club Specialties, PWD Health Foundation, memorials for our club dogs that pass over the Rainbow Bridge and for those that turn Senior Citizens, Rabies Challenge and other non-profit dog activities that come up throughout the year. We also have a Rescue Committee that handles all reported PWDs in AZ that need a home – whether it's a lost dog, animal shelter dog, rehoming dogs – for whatever reason this committee takes the dog in and finds a forever home for it.

One big goal of the club is to become AKC Sanctioned. What good does this do the club? It allows us to hold our own Regional Specialty and to hold sanctioned match shows/trials.

2014 Water Trial Manual Changes

The Water Trial Committee submitted recommended changes to the Water Trial Manual for 2014 to the PWDCA Board. The changes were approved and the committee has completed updating the manual. It is now available on the PWDCA website - http://www.pwdca.org/water-work

Many of the changes we're clarifications. Some were based on suggestions that came from participants and judges throughout last year. Some of the most notable changes for 2014 are:

Portions of the Water Trial Report can now be submitted on CD or flash drive.

Site markers must now be consistent from trial to trial, requiring them to stick up out of the water a minimum of 18" and have at least one stripe on them.

A Water Trial Host Committee may allow dogs to enter below their current level. Previously, a dog could only enter at it's highest titling level (Non-regular, For Exhibit Only:FEO) or at the next level they were hoping to attain. For instance, if a dog had a Working Water Dog title, they could only enter a trial at the Courier level as a Regular entry or if allowed by the host committee, the Working Water Dog level as a FEO entry. Now that same dog could enter Working, Apprentice or Junior as a Non-regular/FEO entry.

NOTE: At a National Specialty, the dog must be entered in its current titling class or the class below (For Exhibit Only) Sounds confusing but basically it allows handlers to trial at any level below their highest titling level.

The minimum age for water trial participants has been lowered from 10 to 9 years of age.

In the event a dog aggression event occurs at a water trial, The Trial Secretary or Trial Chairperson will notify the PWDCA Water Trial Committee Chairperson by phone, no later than the conclusion of the day of the trial. The formal written report will follow within 72 hours.

There are new Versatility exercises and packages for 2014 as well. They are included in the updated manual.

Here is wishing everyone a fun and successful water season!

Dear AKC Obedience Club Officer:

The following recommendations were presented to the AKC Board of Directors at the February 2014 meeting and were to address the concerns of dog-on-dog attacks in the Group Exercises. Incidences of this nature are rare in obedience group exercises – there have been two in the past three years. Nevertheless, the situation is quite disturbing for the sport. Many owners are naturally concerned. The Companion Events Department felt it was prudent to review the Regulations and Guidelines to insure that all reasonable steps were being taken to minimize this type of occurrence.

- 1. If a dog has non-qualified in an individual exercise and, in the opinion of the judge the dog demonstrated uncontrolled behavior, the judge must release the dog from performing the group exercises. (Chapter 3, Section 12 and Guidelines Chapter 3)
- 2. Dogs must be spaced with a minimum of 4 feet between each dog. (Chapter 3, Section 12)
- 3. Require that dogs be under control while entering and exiting the ring. (Chapter 3, Section 12)
- 4. Judges must stand with their full attention on the dogs and remain alert for potential problems. (Guidelines, Chapter 3)
- 5. In Novice group exercises, the judge must promptly instruct the handler to remove a dog that interferes. (Chapter 3, Section 12 & Guidelines, Chapter 3)
- 6. In Graduate Novice and Open classes, if a dog leaves the place where it was left during the group exercise, the judge has the option of either asking that the handler be recalled to remove the dog or promptly instructing the steward to remove the dog, depending on the nature of the occurrence. The judge's decision shall be guided by consideration for the safety of all involved. Two stewards must assist the judge and both stewards must be provided slip leads to remove a dog. (Chapter 4, Section 15 & Guidelines, Chapter 2 and Chapter 3)
- 7. At the conclusion of a group exercise, the judge will state: "Exercise finished. Put your leash on your dog. Maintain control of your dog." (Chapter 3, Section 12)
- 8. If a judge observes any signs of aggression or potential problems with the dogs as they are assembling for the group exercise, the judge must excuse the dog. (Guidelines, Chapter 3)


As a result, the *Obedience Regulations and Judges' Guidelines have been amended* by the AKC Board of Directors. These changes are meant to increase the safety of dogs participating in Obedience Group Exercises and are **effective May 1, 2014**. Please view the regulation changes in detail <u>here</u>.
