Saskatchewan Archery Association Scholarship

The Saskatchewan Archery Association Inc. (SAA) will award a scholarship of \$500.00 to one male or one female archer who plans to attend a post-secondary institution.

The scholarship will be named each year for the association with the exception in which a memorial scholarship may be named in memory of a board member or member at large in any given year.

CRITERIA for the Saskatchewan Archery Association Scholarship

Eligibility will be determined by the Awards Committee as set forth in the SAA Constitution and Bylaws. Applicant Instructions and Criteria for evaluation of applicants is listed below.

Applicants must meet the eligibility guidelines which follow:

- Scholarships will be presented each year to one youth archer who will be furthering their educations and attending a post-secondary institution.
- Youth archers are defined by the SAA, for the purpose of this scholarship only, as being age 17 – 21 years of age as of January 1st each year.
- The scholarship money will be presented to the recipient only after confirmation is received from the recipient as proof of enrollment in a post secondary institution.
- Individual youth archers may apply, or may be asked to apply by any SAA club or SAA member.
- Applicants must be current members of the Saskatchewan Archery Association and in good standing.
- The applicants must have participated in a number of SAA activities throughout his/her high school years.
- The applicant must have demonstrated leadership and sportsmanship during their time as an SAA member.
- Applicants must be good citizens and role models in their sport and their community.

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INSTRUCTIONS FOR APPLICATION TO THE APPLICANT

Please forward pages one and two with the 4 documents noted below to the Executive Director listed on the SAA website, postmarked no later than August 30th. <https://saskarchery.ca/board-of-directors>

FOUR DOCUMENTS TO BE INCLUDED WITH APPLICATION

1. Copy of Transcript of Grade 12 marks
2. Up-to-date resume to include:
 - (a) List of archery event participation during grades 10 to 12 (or in the most recent 3 years)
 - (b) Any academic and sports awards / recognition received during grades 10 to 12 (or in the most recent 3 years)
3. A reference letter from a coach, or a teacher or the principal of your high school or a community member (excluding family member or an employee of the school you attend).
4. An essay (minimum 350 words) that speaks to how you got involved in the sport of archery, what you have learned through the sport and what your further ambitions in the sport of archery might be.

TO REFERENCE WRITERS

- It would be helpful to the evaluators for this award if reference writers would comment upon the positive qualities they have observed in the applicant.
- In addition, it is important for the reference writers to comment upon specific examples of the circumstances in which those qualities were demonstrated by the applicant.
- Please include your contact information on the reference letter
- All reference letters should be signed and dated by the reference writer.

EVALUATION OF APPLICATIONS

NOTE: Applicant who have **not been** a past recipient will be considered prior to consideration of any applications received where the applicant has been a previous recipients of an SAA scholarship. **20% Academics** -- Marks in grade 12 and any academic awards and recognitions the applicant received in grades 10 to 12.

40% Athletics -- Participation in archery as well as in-school athletics grades 10 to 12 (or in the most recent 3 years). Awards and recognition received for in-school and out-of-school athletic activities grades 10 to 12 (or in the most recent 3 years)

20% Participation in archery specific events during grades 10 to 12 (or in the most recent 3 years) **20%**

Character -- Good citizenship and positive role modeling in school and out of the school.

FOLLOW UP

In the case that a scholarship recipient receives a "memorial" scholarship in any year, they will be required to send a Thank-you letter to the SAA that can be forwarded to the family, immediately after receipt of the scholarship.
