Interestingly, we had a couple different varieties of thistle...a first in my seven years in the wildscape. The white honeysuckle vine is also filling out very well and will be blooming soon. This year we will be planting some new plants. It has been a while since we've been able to responsibly plant some new plants and we'll be putting our heads together to decide which natives to try.
