### 2024 UWF Reading Program

*The Book Woman of Troublesome Creek* by Kim Michele Richardson

Ann Robar reports, "This was a terrific book where I learned about the WPA's library project in the 1930s, the poverty of the coal miners in Eastern Kentucky at the time, as well as a genetically linked enzyme deficiency that caused some people to have blue skin and brown blood."

The lonely young Appalachian woman, Cussy Mary, joins the historical Pack Horse Library Project of Kentucky and becomes a librarian, riding across slippery creek beds and up treacherous mountains on her faithful mule to deliver books and other reading material to the impoverished hill people of Eastern Kentucky. Cussy's not only a book woman, however, she's also the last of her kind, her skin a shade of blue unlike most anyone else. Not everyone is keen on Cussy's family or the Library Project, and a Blue is often blamed for any whiff of trouble. As she brings books to the hill folks, she's has to confront prejudice as old as Appalachia and suspicion as deep as the holler.

Inspired by the true blue-skinned people of Kentucky and the brave and dedicated Kentucky Pack Horse library service of the 1930s, *The Book Woman of Troublesome Creek* is a story of raw courage, fierce strength, and one woman's belief that books can carry us anywhere—even back home.

This book can be found in the Douglas County Library and is well worth the read.

Each year the United Women in Faith offer a reading program. Men and women of the church are encouraged to read at least 1 book from each of the five categories: Education for Mission, Leadership, Nurturing for Community, Social Action, and Spiritual Growth. Books from the current year & 4 previous years are also eligible. A complete list is on the side of our library shelves or on the UWF bulletin board in the Fellowship Hall.
