Course Syllabus

Course Description

Music Theory focuses on developing a student's ability to recognize, understand, and describe the basic materials and processes of music that are heard or presented in a musical score or work. Students will receive an introduction to listening, writing, and understanding varied aspects of music, such as melody, harmony, texture, rhythm, form, musical analysis, composition, and musical style. Students will also receive an introduction to basic musicianship skills, such as dictation, rhythm speaking, and sight singing. Musical examples, drawn from a variety of time periods and styles will be used to strengthen the student's awareness of these concepts. The student's ability to read and write musical notation is fundamental to this course

Course Materials

All materials will be provided by the instructor. These will include:

- Manuscript Notebook
- Pencil (The only appropriate writing utensil)

Course Requirements
