Missouri City Launches Voluntary "Silent Partner" Program: Community partnerships are vital to the growth and development of a city and can help improve public safety. Missouri City now offers the "Silent Partner" program whereby residents can register their exterior facing cameras with the City's police department to possibly assist in solving crimes. The new program will help detectives investigating a crime in the vicinity of a residence with a registered camera to access potentially helpful footage. The program is entirely voluntary and consent to view video footage from your camera may be withdrawn at any time. City Improvement May Offer Residential Insurance Benefit: The Insurance Services Office (ISO) rating for Missouri City helps determine the cost of insurance for residents and businesses. After implementing several changes, the City's residential rating rose from a 7 to a 4 which is the range for smaller Texas communities. This is the 2nd highest discount with participating insurance providers (not all insurance companies use the ISO for rating analysis). Residents can contact their insurance agent to determine if and how the updated ISO rating will affect their premiums.
