## **Building Renovation & Improvements**

Welcome back, Board Member, Gary Christoff.
Gary is heading our Building Renovation
Committee. Thanks to an anonymous donor, we
were able to purchase one new refrigerator and 2
new freezers. We have widened doorways and
aisles, rearranged and added shelves and walls,
leveled the concrete pad, drywalled and painted
offices, and weeded and mulched outside.

Next steps will include the installation of our new BACM sign and lighting, replacing a few folding tables with solid wood tables to hold the weight of tons of potatoes and vegetables, adding a large wall to divide the sanctuary into a bulk food storage room and a community meeting room, and cutting a new driving path from the top parking lot to the bottom parking lot. This change to the parking lot will allow more cars into the lot; to get the traffic off of the street faster. We are still looking for a donation or discount on gravel. If anyone is in the position to help, we would love to hear from you. We will host an Open House toward the end of Summer to allow the community to see the progress made so far.

Many thanks to all who donate their time, food, and funds to BACM!!! We are in unforeseen times due to food shortages, which are only going to get worse. The Akron Canton Regional Foodbank has shortages of many staples. Their prices have tripled along with our increases of those in need. I am working with our local stores to help procure products we need. They also have limits on what to order. Pasta is in demand, but difficult to find. We use 495 boxes of macaroni and cheese, 600 cans of soup, and 770 canned vegetables a week. We thank all who donate, we couldn't do it without you and the good Lord who always answers my prayers for the pantry!!!

Our building renovation fund is separate from the food funding, so never do we use the funds for food for renovations. We have volunteers that are working on the renovations as we get materials in. We have several who are donating their time and funds out of their own pockets to assist us with making our Resource Center a reality.
