BACM Open House & New Resource Center

On February 8, 2023 BACM acquired the Summit Mennonite Church. Committee members worked all summer to raise funds and renovate the building to better suit the pantry's need.

Only eleven months ago BACM was in a precarious position. The demand on the pantry had risen in 2022 and 2023 because of the economy. The number of people we served grew dramatically. Simultaneously, inflation was significantly impacting our costs for food

products. There were still food shortages from Covid, especially for staple items. Throughout last year we could not get items we needed and/or the quantity. The Akron Canton Regional Foodbank was experiencing the same scenarios. When we could get ample product, we could only buy an amount that would fit our limited space. For the past couple of years we had ran out of room to effectively and efficiently operate the food pantry. Several properties were considered and lots of time and effort was exhausted to determine the feasibility of moving BACM. Then in 2022 the Summit Mennonite Church and BACM worked to reach a win/win situation for both organizations. The church wanted to see a ministry continue in the building and BACM would have the space it needed to optimize operations of the food pantry.

So, in early February of 2023 BACM began a new chapter and set out to better serve the communities that utilize the pantry. In addition, there was a lot of work to do to improve operations. Needless to say, BACM stepped out in faith and good business principles to make BACM an even stronger organization than it previously had been. I am pleased to inform you in early 2024 BACM is stronger than ever before and is efficiently meeting the needs of those we serve. We have been good stewards of the money, food, time and other items that have been donated to BACM. The success of BACM is a result of what communities can do when working together for a common good in serving our residents in need. There are so many people to thank and most are listed in this newsletter. I especially want to thank the City of Barberton and Mayor Bill Judge for the much needed support that BACM received. Thank you to John & Brittany and The Cominsky Family Foundation for their partnership with BACM. Thank you to the police and fire departments of the communities we serve for your faithful support. One final thank you to the donors who wish to remain unnamed.

I invite you to come and visit BACM at your earliest convenience and see how it has grown. We welcome services, clubs and other organizations to use our meeting facility. Consider being a volunteer. In closing, please know that the BACM Board of Directors and the BACM staff will continue to be good stewards and maintain the trust you have given us.
