Introduction to the Sermon on the Mount

5 Now when Jesus saw the crowds, he went up on a mountainside and sat down. His disciples came to him, ² and he began to teach them.

The Beatitudes

He said:

- ³ "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
- ⁴Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted.
- ⁵Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth.
- ⁶Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.
- ⁷Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy.
- ⁸Blessed are the pure in heart,

for they will see God.

⁹Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.

¹⁰ Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

¹¹ "Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me. ¹²Rejoice and be glad, because great is your reward in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you.

Things to know:

- The Beatitudes are blessings given to the ones that possess them.
- Jesus liked to teach his followers
- Jesus is a patient teacher
- Jesus likes an eager student
- The Beatitudes should guide how we live
- There are blessings that follow each promise
- Jesus' blessings are universal
- The Beatitudes are similar to Luke 6:20-23
