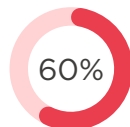

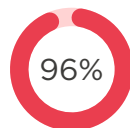

The Junior League of Macon was founded as the Utility Club in 1924 and was adopted by the Association of Junior Leagues International in 1937. Over the years, the League has played a crucial role in improving the lives of women, children and impoverished individuals in our community, from helping open the Discovery House at the Museum of Arts and Sciences and the Ronald McDonald House, to helping build the handicap-accessible playground at Amerson River Park. Through this work, the League continues to fulfill its mission of developing women leaders through service.
