A Message from Pastor Jaime

What star are you following? Where is it leading you?

On the first Sunday in January – January 7 – we will celebrate Epiphany in worship (even though the official day of Epiphany is, as always, January 6). We will hear the story of the magi, or wise men, who were led by a star to the Christ Child. They present him with three gifts: gold, frankincense, and myrrh. (That's the only "three" in the story! Our songs and Christmas pageants often feature three wise men, but Matthew doesn't give us a number of people, just a description of three gifts.)

In recent years, a tradition of Epiphany "star words" has been growing more popular. You may remember receiving a star word last year. Perhaps you practiced this tradition in the past as well

If you received a star word last year, do you remember what it was? Mine was "dwell." I have it tacked to one of my bulletin boards. When I look up from my computer, it's a reminder to pause, to be present in the moment, to dwell with the God who comes to dwell with us in Jesus. It's a reminder on my busiest days that I am not the savior, that the world keeps turning by God's power, not mine.

This year, you'll have another opportunity to choose a star word. How might that word guide you? Maybe it will guide your actions. Maybe it will guide your prayers. (Maybe you won't like your word, and you'll be guided to trade for a different word.)

In a newsletter article on the website of the Presbyterian Church (USA), a pastor from New York talks about introducing star words to her congregation: "Some people were intrigued with their word. Some traded their stars for a better word. There was even one woman who had a negative reaction to the word on her star, but she kept it anyway."

Whatever word you choose – or whatever word chooses you – let it guide you to be purposeful this year about what and whom you are following. Are the "stars" we follow guiding us to Jesus
