

OAK BROOK—The Clarendon Hills chapter of the Infant Welfare Society of Chicago auxiliary (CHIW) unveiled its annual benefit theme at Pinstripes on Oct. 16.

The chapter held a meeting upstairs, before benefit chairs Jen Alsman and Amy Lizzadro disclosed the theme for the 2024 benefit, which will be held at The Westin in Lombard on Feb. 3.

The benefit—the chapter's largest annual fundraiser—will adopt a "Roaring Twenties" theme.
