

#### **OVERALL:**


- Maintains a clean and consistent supply of cards.

#### FOR THE SCRUM MASTER:

- Maintains the analysis wall.
- Owns ensuring a clean flow of work to team.

### FOR THE PRODUCT OWNER:

- Serves as proxy PO. (Not full substitute!)
- Provides enterprise-level thinking & analysis.
- · Writes stories with quality.
- Guides decomposition & prioritization.
- Coordinates with other disciplines. (UX, copy, etc.)







