This group of over 100 volunteers in Mid-Missouri builds hand-cranked mobility carts that allow them to go where ordinary wheelchairs won't go. They make large and small crank carts and a pull cart. Last year, they distributed 1656 carts in over 100 countries worldwide. Lloyd Viehland,
