

Ladies, we can change the world, one child at a time!



# **East Missouri District 1st Quarter Conference**

The East Missouri Optimist District 1st Quarter Conference was held October 22-23, 2021 at the Courtyard by Marriott in St. Peters, MO. The 100th anniversary of our creed was celebrated and the new Optimist theme for the 2021-2022 year is labeled "Net 212," the number of degrees of Optimism. 211 degrees is just hot water, but 212 is boiling!

OIF Director Marc Katz gave a presentation on recognition levels and grant opportunities. He talked about scholar-ships for Oratorical & Essay, the Pass Through Program, the Club Campaign Program and endowments that the Foundation made. The OIF assisted 334 Optimists to help 9691 children and families.

Governor-elect Ernie Wren continued with a talk concerning grant writing. Another session involved hypothetically running your club on \$212, \$2120, \$21,000 and \$212,000. Team building was another topic-getting to know your members before trying to plug them into a program. New this year is Kids Speak Out! Speech Contest and a Visual Art Contest.
