Our club is pleased to honor outstanding law enforcement officers. Each department selected an individual who represents the best in his/her service to the community. Please read the tributes as presented.



#### **Crystal City Police Department**

Chief Chad Helms nominates
Patrolman Jack Montgomery from
the Crystal City Police Department

On May 26, 2020, Patrolman Jack Montgomery provided medical assistance to a subject in the process of childbirth. Not only did he do this, he provided critical medical assistance to the newborn infant which had stopped breathing. Patrolman Montgomery physically unwrapped the nuchal cord, which was wrapped around the infant's neck multiple times, thus allowing the infant to begin normal breathing. Patrolman Montgomery will be receiving a "Life Saving" award for his actions.





#### **DeSoto Police Department**

Chief Jeff McCreary nominates Officer Eric Robinson from the DeSoto Police Department.

Officer Robinson consistently led the department in activity of traffic enforcement and arrests. His proactivity has led to his ability to identify problem areas and persons who are persistent offenders. Officer Robinson has done this while also serving as a Field Training Officer

#### **Festus Police Department**

Patrolman Kelsey Schleusner is nominated by Festus Police Chief Tim Lewis.

# Jefferson County Sheriff's Department

He retrieves digital evidence, analyses it, and documents various images and intelligence from crimes ranging from child abuse, sex crimes, to homicides. The job is not technically easy, but more importantly at time not mentally easy either. Detective Frazier does an incredible job balancing his responsibilities of his work and his home. As a result of his work, many Jefferson County victims have been rewarded with justice.





#### **Pevely Police Department**

Captain Larry Miller of the Pevely Police Department nominates Officer Kayla Boyd and Corporal Joe St. Clair for their joint effort.

On Sunday, June 7th, 2020, at 2:04 A.M., while patrolling Pevely Park, Corporal Joe St. Clair and Officer Kayla Boyd observed a vehicle parked at the end of the driveway on the southwest portion of the park. The officers observed the body of a white female laying on the ground outside of the open driver's door. The female was barely breathing, unresponsive, and her clothing were soaked in blood. They immediately summoned for an ambulance who upon arrival discovered a large vertical laceration on the females left arm just above her Humeral Trochlea from a suicide attempt. The actions of these officers saved the life of this person who would have succeeded in her attempt to commit suicide had they not checked the park. This woman was also able to get the help she needed at the hospital.

#### TWIN CITY AREA OPTIMIST CLUB RECEIVES GRANT



For the third consecutive year, the Jefferson Foundation has awarded a grant in the amount of \$5,000.00 for the coming fiscal year 2020-2021 for the Coats for Kids / Head Start Christmas Projects. Grant funds will be used to purchase coats and outerwear (hoodies, hats, mittens / gloves) for students in need throughout southern Jefferson County. Items are requested by contacts at area schools, Head Start, Homeless Youth Initiative, and via other special requests. In order to maintain privacy, the items are delivered directly to contacts. 
