The following Council Members were present, Robert Boice, Gus Guenther, Dave Stellfox, Edward Robinson, Glen Gitzen, Jon Hiser and Mayor Butler, James Harmon was absent.

Motion was made by Ed Robinson and seconded by Gus Guenther to approve the Minutes from the last meeting with the following corrections, the Borough is allowed to lend money to the Sewage Fund and the Engineer review cost of \$1800.00 was seconded by Gus Guenther all present voted yes. Motion was made by Ed Robinson and seconded by Dave Stellfox to approve the Minutes from the Special Meeting with a correction in the spelling of Bob Boice's last name and all present voted yes.

Visitors: Dean Convery was present to discuss the confusion in getting his Occupancy Permit; he has the state license for his Motel. Council told him to get with his Attorney and meet with Alan Vagasky of the Planning Commission on what he will need. The Borough is waiting for a letter from Michael English and will call him when the letter comes to the Borough Office.

Nick Vaccarello was present to discuss some issues he has. He wanted to know how long is the stone going to be blocking his road. Todd Wilson has to have his mail put into Nick's mailbox because he says the mail delivery person cannot get to Todd's mailbox. Rob Hixson talked to her and she said Rita Vaccarello gave her permission to put Todd's mail in their box and that she has asked Todd Wilson several times to move his mailbox and that was before the stone issue. Nick also announced he is resending allowing the Borough to use his driveway as a turn-a round and that they should build a cull-a sac at the end of the road. Nick Vaccarello reported that the Borough did not put the correct pipe in at Pizza Shop project. Nick Vaccarello reported that the old sewer pipes are a biohazard and they should rectify the hazard. Parks: Bob Boice had nothing to report.

Streets: Gus Guenther reported a Watch Children sign was put up on Oakview Drive. The Monroe Street survey has been received and the Street Committee will go over it.

Police: The Police Report was presented by Mayor Butler with 1 theft of a basketball hoop, total hours worked 26, and miles patrolled 71. The new Officer has one test to complete and Chief Tatton will have him qualified at the firing range next week. The Borough employees need traffic control classes, Chief Tatton will get the dates for them.

Personnel: Gus Guenther is trying to get in touch with Shawn McElroy to set up a meeting with him.

Maintenance of Facility: Gus Guenther had nothing to report.

Library: Raffle tickets are still available at the Library.

Planning Commission: Alan Vagasky stated that people are asking for Zoning Maps and he only has one original from 1982. Jon Hiser volunteered to re-do the map for the Borough and will contact Rob Hixson for any questions. The Solicitor will be asked about giving copies of the maps to residents and what to charge.

Mayor: Mayor Butler attended the Borough Association meeting and met two ladies from the Pa. Borough Association and they talked to him about a webinar class on line that our Borough secretary should sign up for, Mayor Butler will give her the information.

Old Business: Glen Gitzen asked will there be a fence and an all weather structure built at the pump stations. This will be done in the near future.

Communications: There is a letter from American Tower that will be discussed at the Sewage Meeting.

Motion was made by Glen Gitzen and seconded by Dave Stellfox to have Bill Osborne mow around the Pond and all present voted yes.

Pay Bills: Motion was made by Gus Guenther and seconded by Jon Hiser to pay the bills from the General Fund and all present voted yes. Motion was made by Gus Guenther and seconded by Ed Robinson to pay the bills from the Sewage Fund and all present yes.
